## 50 PERCENT GAIN IN TOURIST CARS

The report of the secretary of state of the number of out-of-state cars registered in 51 chamber of commerce in Oregon shows total registration in the state during August was 31,196 as against 20,186 last year, a gain of 50 percent. This is the first time that August registration has exceeded the July count.

Registration of out-of-state cars during August in some of the key points along tourist routes shows: Grants Pass, 5,508; Ashland, 3,689; Brookings, 3,248; Arlington, 1,986; Klamath Falls, 1,161; Ontario, 1,160; Cave Junction, 1,149.

Grants Pass continues to lead registration, so far this year, Grants Pass has 20,684; Ashland, 18,093; Brookings, 11,021; Arlington, 6,326; Klamath Falls, 4,141; Cave Junction, 3,616; Medford, 3,020; Portland, 2,818; Ontario, 2,345.
