

PLANS LINED UP FOR HEARING ON FLOOD CONTROL

Three Counties To Present
Evidence On Rogue River
At Confab Here Saturday
—Loss To Be Stressed.

Expert testimony was being lined up today for presentation at the public hearing to be held at 9:30 Saturday morning in the Jackson county court house auditorium on Rogue river flood control and allied subjects.

The hearing will be conducted by Lieut. Col. Milo P. Fox, army district engineer with headquarters at Portland. County Judge Earl B. Day will preside.

Briefs are being prepared for filing with Colonel Fox. As the hearing is public, a large volume of evidence will also be placed in record orally it is expected.

Janouch Helps
Presentation of evidence will be made for the most part by the resources sub-committees of the planning commissions of Jackson, Josephine and Curry counties. It was stated today by the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce, which has been making preparations for the hearing.

The Jackson county sub-committee is composed of Olen Arnspiger, manager of the Medford and Talent Irrigation districts; Paul Rynning, county engineer, and Clinton Smith, county watermaster. Karl L. Janouch, supervisor of the Rogue River national forest, has been co-operating with the group in gathering facts and figures. Mr. Janouch being in an advantageous position to gain knowledge of the Rogue river and its tributaries. His work was described by the chamber as of great value.

The Josephine county sub-committee is headed by Wilford Allen, long a civic leader in Grants Pass. Curry county planning commission has not notified the chamber of commerce of its sub-committee personnel.

To Show Loss
Briefs and oral testimony will be introduced to show the actual loss caused this section through the lack of flood control of the Rogue river and its tributaries," said A. H. Banwell, manager of the chamber of commerce. "It is intended to show the advantages that would accrue from flood control in the storage of water, watershed protection, timber conservation and the preservation of recreational areas."

"It is also expected that mention will be made of levee work along the streams."

"Our whole presentation will lead up to the point where we hope the engineers will make a survey. We believe we can disclose enough economic loss to demonstrate that flood control expenditures would be a worthy and desirable investment needed to end great loss to this section of the state."

Governor Interested
"We are asking everyone interested in flood control to attend the hearing, especially farmers, lumbermen, recreation planners and irrigation proponents."

Representative James W. Mott will attend the hearing. Senators Charles L. McNary and Frederick Steiwer have been invited but have not yet been able to state whether they will be present. Mr. Banwell said. Governor Charles H. Martin informed the chamber that he would be unable to attend but stated he was greatly interested in flood control and would study a transcript of the hearing.
