Tiniest Baby Loses Fight for Existence

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, Sept. 15.—(UP)—Twenty-five-ounce Janice Peterson, Salt Lake City's tiniest baby, lost an 18-day fight for life when she died Sunday at Salt Lake general hospital.

The 15-inch mite, who was kept in an incubator, weighed 34 ounces at birth August 26, but lost weight steadily despite doctors' efforts to save her. She was so tiny she could be fed only with a medicine dropper.

MERCY PROMISED ON CONFESSION OF SINS PASTOR POINTS OUT

Fred M. Weatherford, pastor evangelist, Sunday night at the Church of the Nazarene spoke on "Sin Portrayed in the Drama of Life," using as his text Proverbs 28:13, "He that covereth his sins shall not prosper; but those who confess them and forsake them shall have mercy."

In part his message follows: "In God has set up a tribunal in the conscience and made every person a judge, in the light of Divine Truth of his own actions. Yet there is no tribunal that so corrupts justice and violates trust in the radius of that jurisdiction. The conscience is faithful in prompting to right decision, but too often it is smothered and silenced by the sin of a violated conscience."

"He who covers sin is a hypocrite parading under a mask. Sin is covered by lying or by placing the blame on someone else. It is tragic when a father or mother who are responsible for lives near their children 'without a Christian education. A little girl came into our Sunday school, nine or ten years of age, who had no Bible knowledge."

"Achan, of Bible history, stole a golden wedge, a beautiful Babylonian garment, and hid them in his tent. But through the prophet of God his covered sin was located. Nothing can be covered from the Almighty. Matt. 10:26. 'There is nothing covered that shall not be revealed, and hid that shall not be known.'"
