QUICK MOBILIZATION OF SPECIAL DEPUTIES ORDERED AT SALINAS

Sheriff Abbott led a raid last night on headquarters of the Fruit and Vegetable Workers' Union, which called the strike two weeks ago in support of its demand for hiring preference, but found no trace of weapons, he said he sought.

The federation threatened a recall movement against Governor Merriam unless he curbed "lawless activities" of the state highway patrol and demanded he and E. Raymond Cato, head of the patrol, either prove or withdraw statements the strike was directed by communists.

Leaders of the 3,000 striking men and women packing sled workers, meanwhile, awaited the expected arrival of Joseph Casey, American Federation of Labor organizer, ordered here by William Green, federation president.
