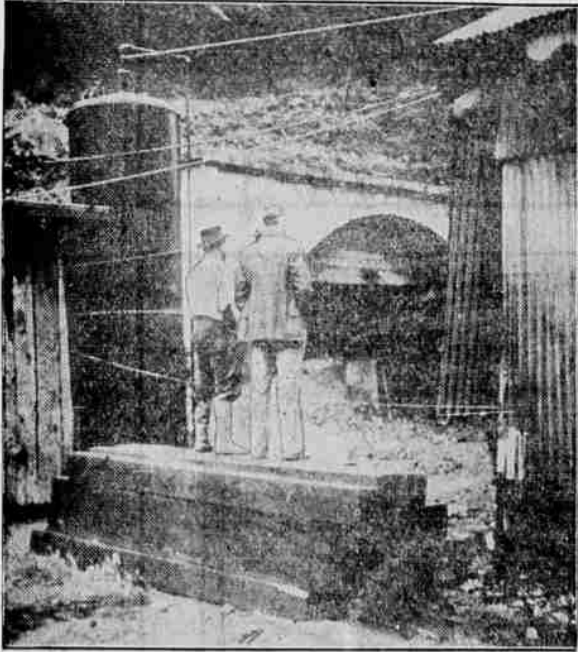


WHERE BLAST KILLED TEN



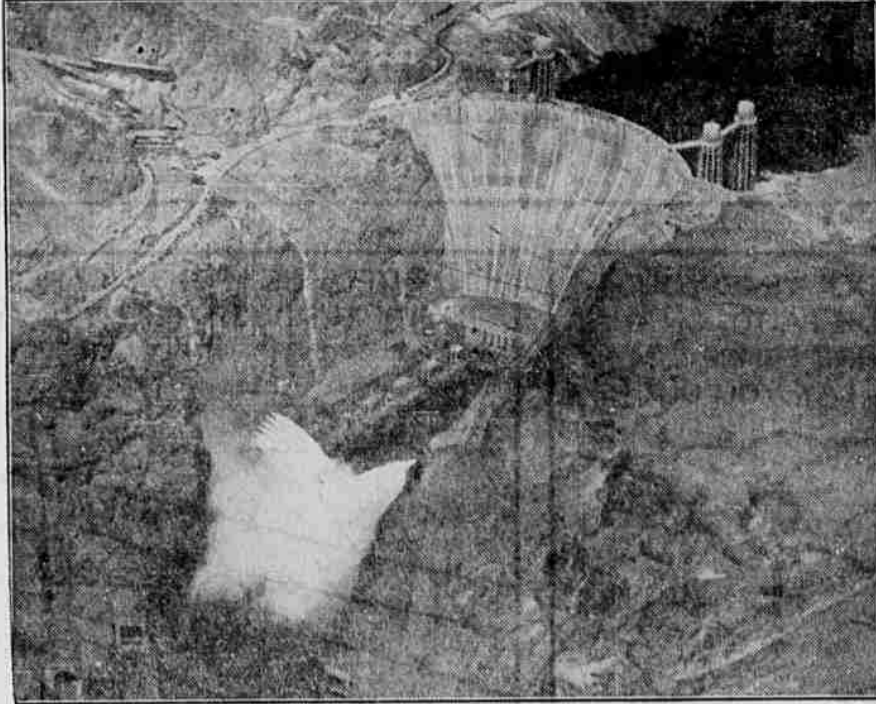

GIANT FALLS CREATED BY BOULDER DAM OUTLETS

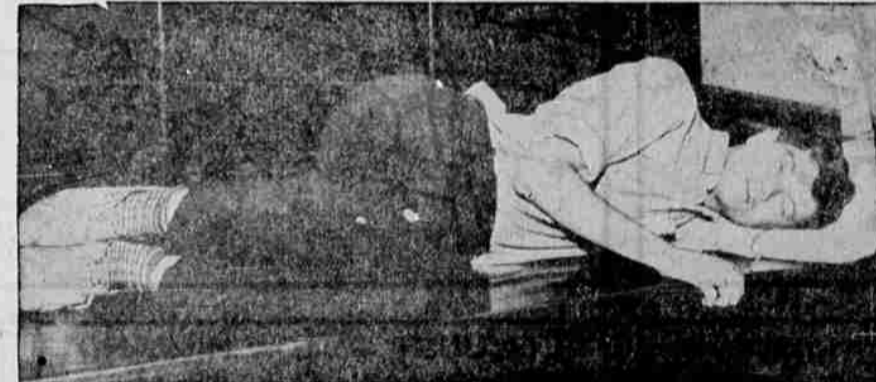

YOUTH UNPERTURBED OVER KILLING WIDOW



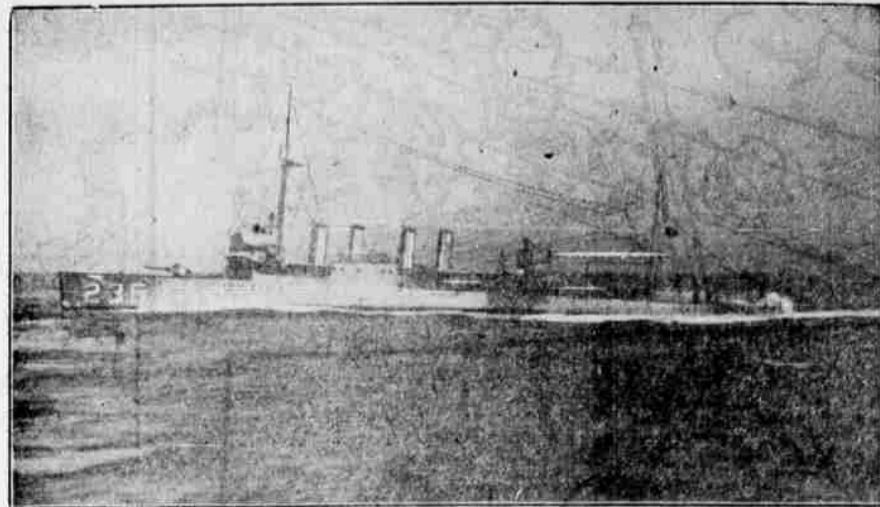
