SALEM, Sept. 22.—(AP)—Bids on construction of the new Oregon state capitol, under one contract, will be called for about October 1, J. A. McLean, chairman of the state capitol reconstruction commission, said here today. McLean said the next session of the commission would be held in Portland, probably September 29 at which time the final details of the plans will be considered.
