Sympathetic Twins Eyed By British Medical Men

PATRICROFT, Eng., Sept. 23.—Sympathetic twins — who suffer identical pains when only one of them is ill or injured—were under observation by British physicians today.

They are William and Thomas Stockie, 5 years old. Thomas is now in the Royal Manchester hospital where doctors are working to save his left eye, which was injured while playing.

Shortly after the accident William's eye began to swell. At first doctors were puzzled as to why, but today William, recovering, said a playmate had flipped a matchstick in his eye.

That didn't explain other coincidental maladies of the Stockie twins. The mother told the physicians

the same thing had happened many times since the twins were born.

"When anything goes wrong with one of them, it always happens to the other, too," she asserted.

"A short time ago one of them was in the house and he complained of an earache. A few minutes later the other twin, who had been outdoors playing and had not seen or spoken to his brother for hours, came in to complain of earache.

"We know they don't plot them, because on several occasions they have not been near each other all day. It was just the same when they were too young to plot anything."

Several doctors said they had heard of similar instances but declined to comment on the Stockie case pending further study.

RADIUM DENTURES CURE FOR CANCER

CHICAGO, Sept. 23.—(AP)—Radioactive "false teeth" were demonstrated at the tumor clinic of Michael Reese hospital today as a new form of treatment for cancer of the mouth.

Molded of metal, they fitted over teeth and gums in the same way as dental plates.

Where the gums of the patient were cancerous, the "teeth" exposed them to radiation from radium hidden in the mold. Where tissues were healthy, the mold was covered with lead to cut off the rays.

The "teeth" were shown and explained by Dr. Max Cutler, famous cancer specialist of Chicago.

Dr. Cutler told cancer experts who came to a post-graduate course at the clinic this week that cures of mouth cancer were being effected "every day" with the aid of the "teeth."

The only problem, he said, was to get the cases before they reached too advanced a stage.

REALTORS FAVOR TAX LIMITATION

SALEM, Sept. 23.—(AP)—The Oregon Association of Real Estate Boards, in annual session here last night, voiced its support of the tax limitation amendment which will appear on the November ballot.

The amendment would reduce the total tax on real property to 80 percent of the 1935 base within the next five years.

The association also urged an amendment to the state real estate law providing that no man can be issued a broker's license unless he has been a resident of Oregon for one year.

Ernest A. Miller of Salem was elected president of the association for the next year succeeding E. G. Grabenhorst of Salem. Other officers included T. W. Zimmerman of Portland, secretary, and Fred C. McGowan of Portland, treasurer.

ROOSEVELT, SMITH MAY WE FOR AIR AUDIENCE
