GIANT PEAR PIE TO BE FEATURE OF CELEBRATION

Doors Open 1 P. M., Friday
—Many Contests Listed
—Coronation Queen Opal Set for 8 P. M., Friday

Plans are now completed for the big pear and tomato show at Talent which opens tomorrow afternoon at 1 o'clock for the largest celebration ever held there. The completed program shows a varied list of diversions and entertainment, with the opening feature to be a softball game tomorrow at 1 o'clock. The pear pickers and the tomato pickers will battle for the championship.

At 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon the humorous fat men's race and the balloon shot-put will be held, with the Yreka high school band giving a concert shortly after.

At 3:30 a picked team of donkey busters from the Southern Oregon Normal school at Ashland will tangle with an outfit of baseballers from Yreka. The remainder of tomorrow afternoon's program will consist of judging pear and tomato exhibits.

Saturday Medford Day.

On Saturday, Medford day at the show, a longer and more diversified program has been offered. Final

judging of exhibits will begin at 10 a. m. and continue the remainder

of the morning. At 1 o'clock the various races for prizes will begin, to in-

clude a pear race, three-legged race, bicycle sprint, foot dashes for boys and girls, baseball throwing contest for girls and pear throwing for boys, a pear devouring contest and a race to decide the fastest pie eater.

At 4 o'clock the Medford Craters will mount jackasses for a baseball game against the Grants Pass Cavemen, both squads in their stunt costumes. A good portion of the crowd is expected to attend this feature.

At 7 o'clock Saturday evening the finals of the pear packing contest will be held, and the winner crowned champion of all Christendom. At 7:30 the gigantic pear pie, the largest ever baked, will be cut and distributed to the crowd.

At 8:15 there will be dances and novelty numbers by the students of the Eve Benson dancing academy, Henri Warner acting as master of ceremonies. There will be vocal solo by Mr. Reedy of the Phoenix schools, to an accordion accompaniment.

Dancing at City Hall.

Saturday evening Wagner Gulch will again be in full swing, starting at 8:15 and remaining open until midnight. Dancing will be held in the city hall from 9 o'clock until 2 a. m.

The committeemen who completed arrangements include: Entertainment—Mrs. Lynn Mills and H. H. Love of Talent; contests—Lynn Mills, Stanley Robbins and Clarence Holdridge of Talent; pear pie—J. J. Tryon and Martin Luther of Talent and Michael Beck of Medford; Wagner Gulch—Gorden Ashcraft of Talent; commercial exhibits—L. E. Bickel of Medford, H. Glichest also of Medford, and Ike Fridgegar of Ashland.

The auto exhibit has been in charge of H. L. Claycomb of Ashland, with decorations under the charge of Virgil Leslie of Talent. The pear and tomato exhibits have been arranged by William Boyd of Talent, Ralph Koozer of Ashland and Maurice Spatz of Medford.

Word was received this afternoon that the 25-piece Yreka band and a caravan of from 50 to 100 cars will be present from the California city. In appreciation of the record attendance from southern Oregon at their recent Gold Rush celebration, a police escort from Ashland to Talent has been offered by the Ashland city police.

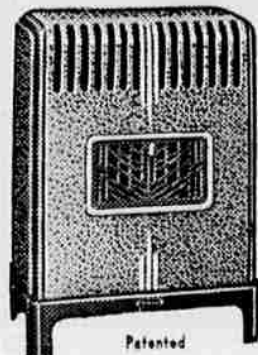

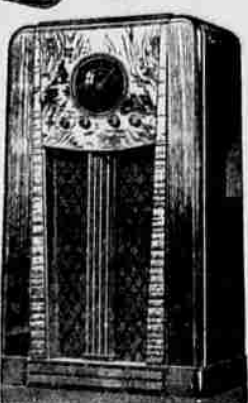
