

"The General Died At Dawn"—Opening Feature Today At Craterian

GARY COOPER STAR EXCITING PICTURE OF MODERN CHINA

Not since "Shanghai Express" has the screen had a motion picture dealing with the adventures of modern China. Starting a three-day run today at the Craterian theater, Gary Cooper and Madeline Carroll, who starred in "The General Died at Dawn," the exciting adventure of a reckless soldier of fortune pitting his wits against the wily war lords of the mysterious Orient. Miss Carroll plays the part of the beautiful woman who is out to lead the adventurer to capture, only to fall in love with the man.

The story is based on the struggle between modern China and the predatory war lords who are laying the country waste. On the one side is General Yang, ambitious war lord intent upon crushing China under his iron heel. On the other side is a growing people's movement. Cooper is in the ranks of this movement. Sent to Shanghai with money with which to buy arms, Cooper is lured aboard a train by Miss Carroll, daughter of a crooked international agent. The train is held up and Cooper captured. Then, when it appears that he is to be put to death, he escapes and the excitement really starts—particularly when both he and the girl learn of their love for one another.

Playing the part of the war lord is Akim Tamiroff, whose characterization of the role is said to be one of the high spots of the film. Others in the cast include William Frawley, Dudley Digges, Porter Hall and J. M. Kerrigan.

A new screen team, Joan Bennett and Joel McCrea, refreshing in their new comedy and delightful in their romantic moments, will be starred in "Two in a Crowd" at the Craterian theater Wednesday only.

When the story opens, the two halves of a torn thousand dollar bill bring the pair together. Their escapades on New Year's Eve lead to further hilarious developments that plumb the depths of humor.

Dashiell Hammett Story On Rialto Two Feature Bill
