from Buckingham place, official residence of King Edward, Simpson moved into his military club. "The case will not be defended," Simpson authorized the Associated Press to say for him.
The slender, beautiful royal companion, in opening the divorce proceedings, has followed in the footsteps of her friend, the former Mrs. Morgan of Wisconsin, who divorced King Edward in January, 1923, on misconduct charges.
Lady Furness opened the way for Mrs. Simpson to enter King Edward's intimate circle of friends by an introduction to the British monarch. Pending the calling of the suit, Simpson was expected to continue his activities as head of the London office of Simpson, Spencer and Young, commercial brokers.
Mrs. Simpson, it was predicted, will continue to appear in the presence of King Edward.
The name of the king, under no circumstances, will be mentioned during the Ipswich hearing, it was declared, nor will any reference to the friendship between him and the feminine petitioner be made.
Simpson and his wife, their friends asserted, will remain "amicable," in much the same way American film stars continue friendship after being divorced.

John W. Keate, attorney and Democrat, said he would initiate mandamus proceedings to compel A. A. Bailey, clerk, to list legislative candidates in alphabetical order. As the dominant party in the county, the Republican names are printed first with the Democrats second and the independents third.

Harriet McArthur Pioneer Of State Dies In Portland

PORTLAND, Oct. 15.—(AP)—Oregon lost one of its best-known pioneers last night with the death of Mrs. Harriet McArthur, 85, the daughter of a former United States senator and mother of a congressman.
Mrs. McArthur, a native of Hickory, was the daughter of Col. James W. Nesmith, senator from 1861 until 1867 and later a congressman. Her son, the late C. N. McArthur, served as United States representative from the third Oregon district from 1915 to 1923.
Mrs. McArthur was one of the founders of the Oregon State Historical society and was long identified with the Oregon Pioneer association. Her memory of early time in the northwest provided much material for writers.
