

Joan Crawford and Robert Taylor Head Cast of "The Gorgeous Hussy"

LIONEL BARRYMORE, ALISON SKIPWORTH IN HISTORICAL HIT

One of the most exceptional casts of headline stars to ever be placed in one picture brings "The Gorgeous Hussy" to the Craterian theater screen today for a three-day run. Heading the long list of players are Joan Crawford, Robert Taylor and Lionel Barrymore. The story starts with Peggy at the age of fifteen, when she first shocked staid Washington society and continues through a startling career which led her into the very center of life in the nation's politics as the power behind the President's chair.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 17.—(AP)—Hitting a new high record in Pacific coast history, reserve deposits of member banks with the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco rose to \$444,806,000 Wednesday, October 14.

It was a gain of more than 16 millions for the week and extended the rise of the last three months to \$87,512,000. This gain of 23 percent in three months was added to figures that already had set a new peak in coast banking history.
