Chamber Published—Each month the Chamber of Commerce of the United States send to all members a list of 14 outstanding ideas or accomplishments of the various units throughout the country. This month the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce heads the list for its plan of teaching fly-casting and hunting etiquette to students of Medford high school, the aim being to develop genuine sportsmanship and to foster a greater interest in outdoor sport. The plan was projected a few months ago by Dr. Charles W. Lemery. It is anticipated that the local chamber will receive numerous inquiries about the plan as a result of the national chamber's circular letter.
