LEAD COINS USED ON SKILL DEVICES

ROSEBURG, Ore., Oct. 30.—(AP)—Following investigation of a flood of spurious nickels found in Roseburg pinball machines, James McNeil, 28, and Arthur Higginbotham, 24, were taken into custody here last night and will possibly be charged with counterfeiting, Sheriff Percy A. Webb reported today. The sheriff stated that he has confiscated amounts, which he reports were taken in a search of Higginbotham's home at Sutherland, and holds a large number of lead coins. Complaints of pinball machine owners that a great many lead nickels had been found in local game devices, resulted in an investigation last night, and McNeil was taken into custody by a city police officer. Higginbotham, who was accompanying McNeil, escaped from the city officer the sheriff reported, but was later arrested near Sutherland.
