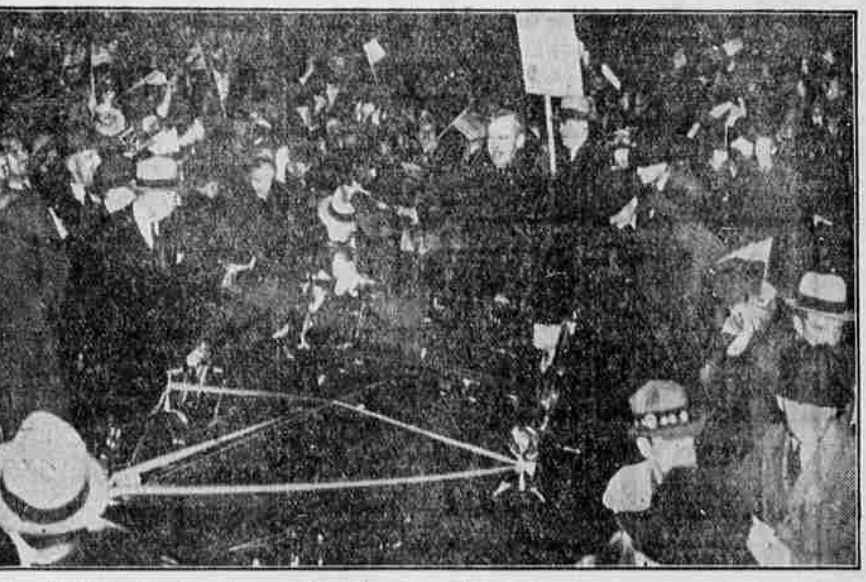

YOUTHS ARRESTED HERE CONFESS TO THEFT 3 AUTOS

ROSEBURG, Ore., Oct. 31.—(AP)—Automobile thefts at Eugene, Roseburg and Myrtle Creek were admitted by Jack Halfman, Terry Freeman and George Currie, three Portland youths returned to Roseburg last night, following their arrest at Medford, Sheriff Percy A. Webb, reported today. The youths, however, deny the theft of an automobile from Orville Cole, employe at the Winchester Powerhouse. Thefts admitted by the boys, the sheriff said, included cars belonging to Calvin Webber of Eugene, D. E. Hennigh, Roseburg, and H. P. English of Oakland. The latter car was taken from Myrtle Creek. These three automobiles have been recovered. Cole's car, however, is still missing, and Sheriff Webb said he believes the statements of the boys that they did not take the automobile. Charges against the youths have been filed in the juvenile court by Douglas county. CARNEGIE MEDAL VOTED CARPENTER; SAVED A FARMER

PITTSBURGH, Oct. 31.—(AP)—The Carnegie hero fund commission awarded a bronze medal today to Charles H. Matteson, 57-year-old Oakridge, Ore., carpenter who was credited with saving a farmer from suffocating at the bottom of a well. Matteson slid 43 feet down a wind-lashed rope to reach William A. Crispin, 84, who was overcome by gas while at work September 10, 1935. It was reported that another man informed Matteson there was gas in the well and declined to enter it or operate the windlass for the rescuer. The commission said a woman helped lift Crispin to the surface after Matteson attached a rope to the farmer's chest. Another award went to Sidney E. Phillips, 27, Bonanza, Ore., who was credited with aiding in saving a friend from drowning in the Columbia river. HUNTERS WARNED UPON DUCK LAWS

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 31.—(AP)—The experts of the shotgun take to the field tomorrow for one of autumn's premier sports—duck hunting. With the season officially opening Sunday morning, and ending November 30, hunters were warned by Frank B. Wier, state game supervisor, to know their ducks. The canvassback, ruddy, redhead, wood duck and buff head cannot be shot. Likewise, the whistling swan and Ross' goose are forbidden game. Shooting is permitted between 7 a. m. and 4 p. m., and no hunter may possess more than 10 ducks at one time or four geese or brant. The limit on coots, snipe or jacksnipe is 15.
