NEW ORDER STOPS TOUR GUIDE MAPS FOR CRATER LAKE

No new Crater Lake motorist guide maps or folders for the Oregon Caves and Lava Beds national monuments will be available to tourists next travel season as a result of a recent ruling by the U. S. comptroller general's office to the effect: "Duplicating machines may not legally be used for a character of work which ordinarily would be sent to the government printing office," according to an announcement today by David H. Confield, superintendent of Crater Lake national park. For the past six years the national park service has been publishing material of this kind through the rotaprinting method in its miscellaneous service division, augmenting the work that could be done at the government printing office at greatly reduced cost to the park. This ruling will work particular hardship on Crater Lake national park, Confield said. For the 131 areas under its jurisdiction, the national park service receives approximately \$30,000 to provide for all publications, including the regular pamphlets for Crater Lake, he said. However, due to the limited funds Crater Lake is allotted, only 17,000

copies for an annual approximate total of 20,000 cars and 180,000 visitors, he stated. During the 1936 season, the pamphlets were exhausted before mid-summer. In lieu of the pamphlet, rotaprinted motorist guide maps were given to the visitors, offering them summarized information on what to do and see. Because of the new ruling, no doubt over one-half of next summer's visitors will be denied descriptive literature of any kind, Confield said. The same holds true for the Oregon Caves and Lava Beds, for which funds never have been available for pamphlets, but for which it was possible to provide a limited supply of rotaprinted folders last year from monument funds, he explained. Last week the Crater Lake national park office sent in revised copy to Washington, D. C., for next year's guide maps and folders, but in view of the recent development, it will be impossible to have this material published unless some unforeseen development occurs, Confield stated.

HOUSE IS GUTTED BY FIRE BLAMED ON CHIMNEY LEAK

Residence of Mr. and Mrs. Ernest W. Liljegan at 820 South Grape street was gutted by fire yesterday afternoon. Roots of the two houses adjoining to the south were ignited by sparks but were put out without damage.

AMENDMENT LIMITING AND REDUCING PERMISSIBLE TAXES ON TANGIBLE PROPERTY—Purpose: Constitutional amendment to limit and reduce the total permissible state, tax on real and tangible personal property payable in 1937, to 6 mills annually to 4.8 mills in 1940 and thereafter; limiting county, district, port and political subdivision levies to same total millage payable annually to 4.8 per cent, thereof annually to 4.0 per cent and thereafter. People may vote increase any one year, and reducing such limit 4 per cent thereof annually to 4.0 per cent and thereafter. Shall be assessed one-half true cash value at time assessed.
