EDITORS ANALYZE AMAZING SUPPORT GIVEN ROOSEVELT

Sage of Emporia Says Vote
Denotes Changed Attitude
Toward Government —
New America Is Seen

By William Allen White in the Emporia Gazette (White is a personal friend of Gov. Landon):
"It was not a Roosevelt victory and not a Landon defeat, but it was a revelation of a changed attitude toward government.
"The current of the new attitude

now is rushing on with more fury than direction—perhaps.
"What, then, is this new attitude which has given color and direction to the last two presidential elections? It is a firm desire on the part of the American people to use government as an agency for human welfare. The general welfare clause of the preamble to the American constitution will point the way for a new course in American life.
"We stand at the crossroads. From this day on we shall have a new America, an America in which at least for four years the federal government shall be the strong coercive arbitrator between those who have and those who have not. . . ."

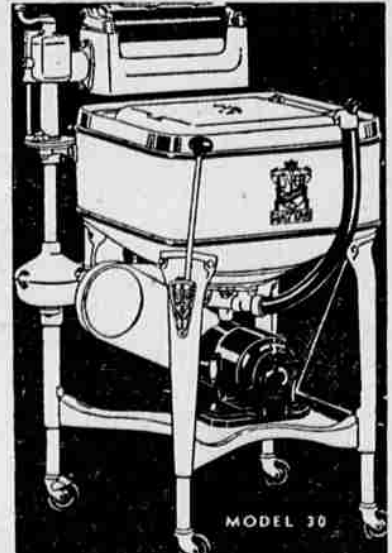
The Chicago Tribune (Republican), commenting editorially on President Roosevelt's victory over Gov. Landon, said:
"Mr. Roosevelt's victory marks the beginning of a new chapter in American history. It is a chapter of which the outlines are already clear. From his own record, and especially from an appraisal of the forces which combined to give him his overwhelming endorsement at the polls, the trends of the next few years can be forecast.

"Vast numbers of men and women voted for Mr. Roosevelt because times are better, but Mr. Roosevelt owes nothing to these followers which he need pay. Neither, of course, does he owe anything to the old line Democrats who remained faithful to their traditional political allegiance. They have been taking orders from Mr. Roosevelt for four years and they will continue to do so in exchange for such patronage as he deigns to bestow. It is not to be expected that their traditional ideals—state rights, individual rights, economy in government—will receive any more consideration at his hands in future than in the past.
"There is one group of his supporters to which Mr. Roosevelt does feel himself indebted, both for ideas furnished him and for votes delivered to him. That is the group which calls itself the popular front as in Spain, in France, and other lands. The bulk of its voting strength can be described as liberal, using the word loosely. Its leadership and its objectives are provided by the radicals."

New York American and other Hearst newspapers (supported Landon):
"The re-election of Franklin D. Roosevelt as president of the United States reflects the present wish of the American people.
"Acceptance of this verdict becomes an immediate obligation upon those who have counselled another course.
"The victory presents new opportunities to Mr. Roosevelt, and puts new responsibilities upon him.
"He cannot be insensible to the fact that millions of his countrymen are not in accord with all he has done in the past.
"It is the duty of Mr. Roosevelt to be the president of these dissenters in as full a measure as he is the president of those who do not question the wisdom of his past course.
"Mr. Roosevelt gave full recognition to that duty in his final message of the campaign at Hyde Park.
"This is the true American spirit. That is the sincere sentiment of Mr. Roosevelt, there is no occasion now to doubt.
"The Hearst newspapers, which opposed the re-election of Mr. Roosevelt because of acts of his past administration with which they could not agree, look hopefully for an administration in his second term more nearly in accord with their conception of good government.
