Calling Here—Mabel Stanley of the Long Mountain district shopped and called on friends here Wednesday.

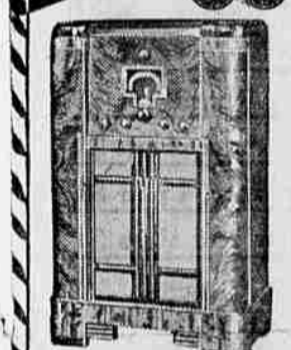
Plans Departure—Mrs. Helen Sweet plans to leave by train tonight for Seattle, Wash.
