1937 BUDGET ESTIMATES—JACKSON COUNTY
Pursuant to the provisions of Section 8, Chapter 446 of the 1933 Session Laws of Oregon, notice is hereby given that the County Court of Jackson County, Oregon, will meet at the Court House, in Medford, Oregon, on the 20th day of November, A. D. 1936, at the hour of 10:00 o'clock A. M. of said day and at the said time and place opportunity will be given for a full and complete discussion of the estimate of the amount of money proposed to be raised by taxation for the ensuing year as published herewith, by any taxpayer subject to such levy when made in favor of or against any of the proposed tax levies herein as the County Court may deem for the best interest of Jackson County.

The County Budget Committee for Jackson County, Oregon, has prepared and submits the following: An estimate of the amount required for each department of County government, County Office and County officer, each County improvement, the maintenance of each County building, structure or institution, the salary of each County officer or employee, including those whose salaries are fixed by statute, for the improvement and maintenance of each public utility and redemption of outstanding warrants, the estimate of the public receipts of the County from sources other than direct taxation upon real and personal property in the County during the period for which such tax is to be levied and an estimate of the probable unapportioned and unexpended balance in the funds of the County on the last day of the current year. The officers' salaries, the County School Fund for 10,000 children at \$10.00 per child, the County School and School Library Fund for 10,000 children at 10 cents per child and the County Library Fund at .0002 of a mill are all fixed by law.

MURDER-SUICIDE ENDS LOVE SUIT
HOT SPRINGS, Ark., Nov. 9.—(AP) Five shots, fired in the privacy of a fashionable hotel apartment, last night ended the lives of Ed Ballard, 63, multi-millionaire sportman of French Lick, Ind., and Robert Alexander, 85, Detroit, Mich., a former business associate.
Ballard was found dead, Alexander dying, when hotel employes forced an entrance to the apartment.
Detective Herbert Akers and Coroner J. P. Randolph announced it was a case of murder and suicide. They said investigation indicated Alexander shot Ballard and himself.
Akers said he was convinced a recent \$250,000 breach of contract suit filed by Alexander against Ballard, in Miami, Fla., led to the fatal shooting.
