

Washington-Southern California Clash May Decide Championship

TILT IN SEATTLE LEADS INTEREST OF COAST FANDOM

Huskies Rule Slight Favorites — Oregon Tackles California, While Indians Meet O. S. C. in Portland

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 13. — (AP) — The Pacific Coast conference football race comes into the homestretch tomorrow with the battle at Seattle between Washington and Southern California perhaps deciding the championship.

Washington, unbeaten in conference play, was held to a 14-14 tie by Stanford last Saturday while U. S. C. lost, 13 to 7, to California. Each team has shown strong air and ground power. The Huskies are slight favorites by virtue of their four conference victories.

Washington State, which was knocked over, 16 to 6, by Oregon State in one of the coast's big upsets last Saturday, stacks up about evenly with twice-beaten U. C. L. A. victors, 7 to 0 over Oregon.

At Portland, Stanford's rejuvenated Indians clash with Oregon State, which traded places in the conference cellar with Oregon last week. Oregon faces California's favored Golden Bears at Berkeley.

Idaho and Montana, the two conference teams relegated to minor league status by the eight-team round robin schedule, battle at Missoula in another close one to pick.

This second engagement of the annual "Little Civil War" series will be played on Hayward field at Eugene. The Webfoot Ducks, winners of the first meeting, 18 to 6, hope to break a precedent existing since 1931. That was the last year either yearling eleven was able to lift both games.

The undefeated Pacific Lutheran team from Tacoma makes its second invasion of Oregon today to meet Linfield at McMinnville. The Luthers whipped Oregon Normal on a previous trip south.

Oregon football attention will swing to Portland on Saturday where the fast-moving Oregon State Beavers hope to push over a victory against the Stanford Indians at Multnomah stadium.

The only other college game in Oregon Saturday will see Pacific university and Albany college clash at Forest Grove.

Oregon Normal goes north to meet Bellingham Normal. In California, the Oregon Webfoots seek their first conference victory over the year in a battle with the Golden Bears of California.

Sunday's action on Multnomah field promises to be lively. The highly regarded Gonzaga Bulldogs will bid in from Spokane to oppose the Portland Pilots.

DUCK HUNTING IS POOR AS FREEZE CONTINUES; FEEDING AREA BURNED

The following bulletin was issued today by the Rogue River national forest service:

"Duck hunting in Upper Klamath lake continues poor because of the cold, clear weather. Feeding ponds have frozen and the birds are staying out in the lake, making it almost impossible for shooting.

"In the smaller streams in the Klamath lake region, as well as in the Rogue river valley, some shooting has been obtained during the past week. Goose shooting has been only fair. Reports indicate that similar conditions exist at Tule lake. No change is expected so long as the present weather conditions prevail.

"In the past several days a fire has swept over a thousand acres of Upper Klamath marsh, destroying feeding grounds for both ducks and

geese. Hunters who are interested in improving shooting should keep this in mind and use the same care of fire in the marshland as in the forest."

MANY TO ATTEND WILDLIFE PARLEY

CORVALLIS, Ore., Nov. 13.—(AP)—Extensive preparation for the statewide wildlife conference called by Governor Charles Martin for Oregon State college November 19 and 20 indicate college officials expect this to be one of the most important meetings of the year.

Governor Martin has expressed a hope that a closely co-ordinated program, backed by a general federation of the various interests, will evolve from the conference.

R. E. Duntch, head of the department of fish, game and fur animal management in the school of agriculture, has been appointed by Dean Schoenfeld to head the arrangements committee. A banquet Thursday night, November 19, to be addressed by the governor, has been scheduled.

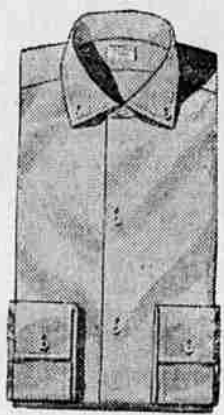

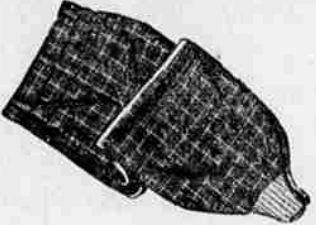
