

SOCIAL SECURITY MEASURE ILLEGAL TOWNSEND AVERS

Pension Plan Inventor Not Very Happy Over Result of Election — Will Check On Congress Adherents

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 13.—(AP)—Dr. Francis E. Townsend, co-founder of the pension plan bearing his name, told 5000 excited adherents today that the federal social security act "will, in all probability, be declared unconstitutional."

"I have that on the word of an eminent authority on the constitution," Dr. Townsend said. "I'm not very happy about the results of the election." Dr. Townsend said with a wry smile. "I thought it would be closer."

"But the people have spoken, and like all good Americans, we abide by the decision. We need not be discouraged. The need still remains and we have not receded one inch from our position."

Discussing the affairs within the Townsend organization, the slim, elderly physician declared: "We're going to put one, and maybe two men in Washington to check up on the men elected on our program. We're going to keep tab on them to see if they're doing anything."

He said, too, that he planned to introduce a new bill before the next session of congress, to supersede the ones already put up.

WILLIAM HOLMES RITES TO BE HELD AT 2:30 SATURDAY

Funeral services for William M. Holmes who died yesterday morning will be conducted by the Rev. E. S. Bartlem in the Conger chapel at 2:30 tomorrow afternoon. Interment will take place in the Jacksonville cemetery where Warren lodge, A. F. and A. M., will conduct graveside rites.

William Montgomery Holmes, Jacksonville resident for 55 years, died at the home of his son, William E. Holmes, on Griffin creek. He was born November 5, 1855, in Chester, Ill. He studied for the law and was admitted to the bar in Illinois in 1878.

Mr. Holmes turned to journalism and edited a newspaper in Illinois

before turning westward. When the movement toward the west developed, he came to Oregon and was admitted to the bar of this state in 1883, though he never practiced law here.

Mr. Holmes settled on a homestead in Woodruff Meadows near Union Creek. For a number of years he engaged in the grist mill business with his brother, the late S. B. Holmes. He established a real estate business in Medford in 1902 and continued in active management of it until his health failed in 1933.

Mr. Holmes made numerous friends during his long residence in Jackson county and was known prominently throughout southern Oregon for his sterling qualities. He was a life member of the Masonic lodge in Jacksonville.

In 1889 Mr. Holmes was married to Emily A. Brown in Jacksonville. He is survived by his wife and four children: George B. Holmes of Eagle Point, William E. Holmes of Griffin creek, Mary A. Moffat of Medford and Ruth C. Holmes of Carmel, Cal. A son, Joseph T. Holmes, was killed in the World war. Also surviving are three grandchildren, Joan Holmes and Jack and Billy Moffat.

ASHLAND HOME BURNS WITH COMPLETE LOSS FURNITURE, CLOTHING

ASHLAND, Nov. 13.—(Sp.)—The house, woodshed and entire possessions of Mr. and Mrs. Cleo Rose, East Main street road near the junction of the Pacific highway, were lost Tuesday afternoon when fire of unknown origin swept through the building.

Mrs. Rose was working in another part of the 10-acre farm when she saw the house in flames. The local fire department was called, but too late to save anything.

The Rose family purchased the place last May and moved in early in August, from the Shady Springs camp on the Bliskiyou. They had modernized the interior of the house and many new fixtures and pieces of furniture had been installed. A

grand piano was included in the loss. The family had large food stocks on hand, including hundreds of jars of fruit and a large quantity of staples, all of which were destroyed. The family was left without clothes of any other belongings.

UNABLE UNLOAD JAPANESE TOYS

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 13.—(AP)—The Japanese liner Tatsu Maru, first major passenger vessel to leave the strikebound port in two weeks sailed at noon Thursday for Honolulu and the Orient.

The vessel circled the main pier of the new \$77,000,000 San Francisco-Oakland bay bridge and then put to sea. On the bridge as the ship made the good will gesture, were Captain Shunji Ito, master of the vessel, Ambassador Joseph C. Grew, who is re-

turning to his post in Japan, and Ricardo Schreiber, newly named Peruvian minister to Japan.

Aboard the Tatsu was a \$100,000 general cargo being returned to

Japan, including \$50,000 worth of Japanese toys that had been intended for the American Christmas trade. Also aboard was \$80,000 in silk that could not be unloaded here.
