

"Ramona", Beautiful Technicolor Masterpiece On Screen At Craterian

LORETTA YOUNG AND DON AMECHE APPEAR IN BRILLIANT CAST

The current outstanding event in the film world is the presentation of Helen Hunt Jackson's immortal love idyll, "Ramona," produced in the new perfected technicolor, which opens today for a three day run at the Craterian theatre. The cast of thousands featuring Loretta Young and Don Ameche, includes such notables as Kent Taylor, Pauline Frederick, Jane Darwell, Katherine DeMille, Victor Killian and John Carradine.

As long as two years ago, preparations were begun for the picturization of this beautiful love story. Many tests were taken before Loretta Young was finally chosen to play the part of Ramona. Don Ameche won over a host of other male players for the part of Alessandro.

"Ramona" was filmed in the beautiful San Jacinto mountain meadow land of southern California, the actual spot where Ramona and Alessandro lived and loved many years ago, as described in the story. The main location was a 55,000-acre ranch in the Mesa Grande area. The site is almost an endless succession of green expanses rolling toward the dusty purple of the far-off mountains, every shade and every tint defined in the clear, dry air, lending itself perfectly to the new Technicolor photography.

As most everyone knows, the story of "Ramona" follows the romance of this convent-bred girl, about whom there is a veil of mystery, and the young Indian chieftain, Alessandro. Ramona's guardian, played by Pauline Frederick, also has a son who is enamored of Ramona, but the mother tries hard to see that nothing becomes of her boy's love for the girl, she alone knowing of Ramona's Indian blood. But when Ramona learns of her Indian heritage, she lets nothing stop her from going to Alessandro and the two live gloriously and happily in their true love. When, however, their land is taken away from them, and they start looking for a new home, events move rapidly to an exciting climax replete with drama and heart-throbbing pathos.
