

COMPLETE FACTS NEEDED ON FORMS OF SECURITY ACT

All Blank Spaces Must Be Filled Out By Employers, Inspector Emphasizes at Meeting in Federal Court

Courtroom in the federal building was filled this morning by employers who gathered to hear an exposition on the social security act by S. H. Morse, postoffice inspector. Mr. Morse explained provisions of the act and answered questions asked by the employers to clarify what is expected of them.

Postal employees of Jackson and Josephine counties also attended the meeting which was called originally for their instruction. Through the intercession of Postmaster Frank DeSouza, scope of the conference was broadened so that employers also might benefit by Mr. Morse's explanations and instructions.

Mr. Morse emphasized that all the blank spaces on the employer forms must be filled out completely and as accurately as possible. When the employer is not certain of the facts he should state them as accurately as he knows them and when he has no knowledge at all he should so state, Mr. Morse said. He stressed that no spaces in the blanks are to be left blank or filled with dashes indicating lack of knowledge.

Postoffices to Help. If any employer is in doubt as to the filling of the forms, he may go to his postoffice for help, Mr. Morse said. He added, however, that in giving aid the postoffice does not pass upon the validity of any part of the act nor is the information given to the employer to be construed as an interpretation of the measure.

Mr. Morse emphasized that the employer forms should be filled out completely and returned to the postoffice as soon as possible. Deadline for return of the forms is November 21.

The forms are to be filled out as of November 16 and therefore would not embrace any employees not employed on that date, Mr. Morse pointed out. To have their employment recorded, therefore, employees who procure employment subsequent to November 16 may fill out their own forms and that should be done as soon as possible, Mr. Morse explained. Employees may obtain the forms and any required instructions at their postoffices, he said.

Mr. Morse left this afternoon for Roseburg to continue his course of instruction.

All land banks, the farm credit administration, and farm credit associations. Goss told the grange the federal land bank and the land bank commissioner had nearly \$3,000,000,000 outstanding in loans—approximately 40 per cent of the farm debt of America.

He cautioned the grangers against gaining the impression that farm credit would be available to borrowers who "make no effort to pay what they owe."

"Congress has insisted that all who can must pay," he said. "The land banks will not foreclose if a borrower is doing his honest best and is capable of carrying a reasonable debt under normal conditions."

Goss urged farm organizations to "sound a warning to farmers to avoid the perils of land inflation."
