NEW YORK, Nov. 18.—(AP)—Although dividends, bonuses and wage increases rolled up to record proportions today, the stock market tripped over selling which effectively halted the surging advance of many recent leaders.

The sharp upturn of the past two sessions, brokers said, induced some traders to cash in part of their profits. Trends were uneven at the close. Transfers approximated 2,900,000 shares.
