ACTIVE CLUB AND PENNEY STORE AID IN TURKEY SCHEME

Plan of the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce to reduce surplus turkey stocks here was carried forward today as additional interests offered their co-operation by the consumption of birds before the holidays.

"The psychological effect of the chamber's plan has been good," said R. G. Fowler, county agent. "It has made people of the county feel good to know that some agency is interested in the welfare of all. Besides this, the plan is procuring direct results. Turkeys are now moving faster to market."

W. S. Bolger, manager of the J. C. Penney department store here, announced today that every employee would be given a turkey for Thanksgiving.

"We are doing this to help the chamber's plan to reduce the county's surplus and at the same time to express our appreciation of the employees' service and loyalty," Mr. Bolger said.

About 25 turkeys will be distributed at the Penney store and it is believed other firms here would adopt the same policy.

The Active club was the first service organization to announce its participation in the plan. William M. McAllister, international president announced that turkey would be served at the dinner-dance to be held in the Chateau next Wednesday night.

The dinner-dance, it was pointed out, is to be a large event as both the Medford and Ashland active chapters will participate. It is a joint fete for members of both clubs and their families.

Hugo Frohreich, manager of the Medford Poultry & Egg company, said his firm would tonight make the largest turkey shipment of the season. A whole carload of 33,938 pounds will leave this evening for San Francisco, he stated.

About 30 turkeys will be disposed of Sunday at the Medford Oun club's shoot.

All other Medford service clubs disclosed plans for the serving of turkey at their meetings, their announcements following closely the Active club's declaration. Included were the Rotary, Kiwanis, Lions and 20-30 clubs.

The 20-30 club said it was holding a special dinner at the Chateau Saturday evening to help carry the chamber's program toward a successful culmination.

1 DEAD, TWO HURT IN AUTO SMASHUP

PORTLAND, Nov. 20.—(AP)—Maurice A. Baker, 25, Portland, died in a hospital today from injuries received last night in a collision near Riverdale.

Two other passengers in the Baker machine, Wilson D. McNary, Jr. and Walter Hillbruner, escaped with bruises and shock.

Baker's automobile slid sideways another driven by Charles E. Gray, Oswego. The Baker machine careened off the road and crashed into a tree, virtually demolishing it.

Baker was an employee of the traffic department of a steamship company and the son of W. A. Baker, traffic manager of a large department store here. McNary is the son of Dr. W. D. McNary, director of the state hospital at Pendleton, and Hillbruner is a reporter on the Oregon Journal, Portland.

Viola Beck Hurt In Auto Accident

Viola Beck, 227 South Central avenue, received a serious head cut necessitating several stitches, when her car got out of control a mile south of Medford on the Crater Lake highway, and ran into the ditch. The accident happened between 9 and 10 o'clock last night as Miss Beck was returning from Klamath Falls via Crater Lake.

She told state police, who investigated the crash, that her brakes had grabbed, sending the car out of control. The machine was not badly damaged.

Pioneer Newsmen Passes At Bend

BEND, Ore., Nov. 20.—(AP)—James M. Lawrence, pioneer Oregon newspaper man, died at his home here. Funeral services were to be held at the Portland crematorium this afternoon.

Lawrence came to the Pacific coast from Wisconsin in 1886. He edited the Oregon City Enterprise and was on the staff of the Salem Statesman. He was an Oregonian editorial worker for many years.

He was a former owner and publisher of the Bend Bulletin. For several years Lawrence operated the land office at Roseburg.

He said, adding that county road officials are desirous of launching an extensive oiling program as soon as possible and before the roads further depreciate to the point where they would have to be rebuilt. The suggestion carried, with the rest of the budget.

Words Discussed

The only other phase of the budget that came up for public discussion was the explanation of the need of weed control, expressed by Henry Conger on behalf of the Grange. Mr. Conger said the star thistle, chicory and white-top were making inroads

upon county grain and alfalfa crops and unless nipped in the bud would cause severe monetary loss to farmers. Star thistle and chicory he classified as annuals that would be eliminated by proper summer fallowing, but he testified that white-top was a far more formidable opponent.

Judge Day explained that white-top was a definite menace, citing several cases in Klamath county where the pestilent weed has made such damaging inroads that the county has had to cover several valuable plots infested by the weed, put chemicals over the entire surface, and retired the land from production for from six to eight years in an effort to kill the weed and bring the land back to tillable condition. He warned that an invasion of Jackson county by white-top would be a real hazard to agriculture here. The budget calls for a \$3,000 fund for weed control.

Motion that the budget be accepted as read was made by A. C. Hubbard, and passed unanimously.

Besides Chairman Dunn and members of the county court, the budget committee is composed of George T. Frey of Medford and Stewart Weeks, McLeod district orchardist.

RATTLER THEORIES CAST INTO DISCARD BY SNAKE CATCHER

PIERRE, S. D.—(UP)—A M. Jackley, snake expert, says that hunting rattlers is as simple as the ABC's—"If you know your business."
