

# STREAMLINE TOYS IN SANTA'S PACK THIS CHRISTMAS

### Miles of Trucks, Railroad Trains, Automobiles and Fleets of Planes Among Record Size Toy Output

NEW YORK (AP)—Prosperity—streamlined—has come around the corner for the Little America of boys and girls.

Sprawling from Santa Claus' \$215,000,000 pack of toys this year are miles of trucks, railroad trains, automobiles and fleets of planes. As accessories there are filling stations, airports, hangars and train sheds. Almost everything in this play panorama is electrified, streamlined and just about the last word in modernity. Almost everything works!

#### Building Boom

A record-size boom in toyland home-building is indicated, with furnishings, in period and modernistic styles, more realistic than ever. Two-car garages, landscaping and roads complete the picture. Automobiles with roomy trailers, latest phenomenon of the adult traveler, women, crowd the roadways in the land of toys.

#### Trick Dolls

A new walking doll raises its feet with grace and doesn't have a wind-up gadget stuck in her back. Other dolls smile, talk or pout, according to mood. Quintuplet dolls have donned toddler clothes and have had their hair cut. There's even a baby doll in an incubator, with oxygen tank and all.

#### Doll Carriages

Doll carriages with safety brakes continue the streamline mode, while a new rocker for baby is the last word in "teardrop" design. New circus sets have whirling trapezes to which little figures cling. When they fall, there is a stretched-out net beneath to catch them.

#### Reflect Peace View

With the exception of toys and games inspired by G-men activities and cowboys, 99 percent of America's Christmas playthings are geared to peacetime pursuits and reflect the nation's adult views against warfare.

There is even a radio set which enables junior to build a short-wave station at home.

#### For out-and-out amusement

there are games of skill galore to keep brother and sister at home, and streamlined roller skates, metal snow-shoes and "airplane" sleds to take them outdoors.

#### PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 30.—(AP)—

carpet an eighth of a mile long had been laid—were the six-foot-tall horse grenadiers of Argentina's liberator, Gen. Jose De San Martin, in blue uniforms with white epaulettes.

#### Argentines Enthusiastic

The route of the 11-car motorcade to the embassy was lined with enthusiastic Argentines, who hurried to their places when the Indianapolis was sighted, ahead of schedule, coming up the muddy Rio Plata.

#### Mounted and foot police

restrained the crowd in the plaza Britanica, near the dock.

#### Within a few hundred yards of the

United States embassy, Mr. Roosevelt's car swung around a monument to the Spanish colonizers of Argentina, in the center of the great square in beautiful Palermo park.

#### Over that memorial a great altar,

surmounted by a cross, was built for the 1934 international eucharistic congress.

#### From the monument, the car turned

into the embassy, where ten rooms have been set aside for President Roosevelt and his aides.

#### The building is situated in a private

park of 44,000 square feet. With its carefully cultivated grass, hedges and rosebuds, in their early summer freshness, it is an ideal place for the president to work.

#### Spectators Break Lines

Police and soldiers stationed along the route had difficulty keeping the spectators behind lines.

#### On the smart Avenida Santa Fe—the

"Fifth Avenue" of Buenos Aires—the crowd burst through in an attempt to approach President Roosevelt.

#### Grenadiers managed to keep them

from completely blocking the way, but one horse and rider were knocked down and another grenadier was unseated.

#### After the procession passed, throngs

rushed into the streets and ran behind Mr. Roosevelt's car.

#### There were many shouts of "Roosevelt! Roosevelt!"

#### The president, holding a bunch of

red roses in his left hand, waved his top hat with his right.

#### In the plaza San Martin the crowd

broke through police lines so rapidly after Mr. Roosevelt's automobile went by, that officers had to use clubs to restrain several of the over-enthusiastic.

#### Mounted police rushed up, their

sabres drawn, and shunted the overflow back behind the markers.

# CHROMITE MINING GOING FORWARD IN SOUTHERN OREGON

### Twenty Tons of Ore Being Taken Out Daily Says Eastern Company Geologist — Sites Kept Secret

GRANTS PASS, Nov. 30.—(AP)—Rustless Iron and Steel corporation of Baltimore, Md., is reopening chromite mines in southwestern Oregon and northwestern California to insure itself of an adequate domestic supply of ore, John Elliot Allen, geologist for the company, revealed today.

#### Ore to be shipped next spring is

now being mined at the rate of 20 tons a day by a crew of five men. Two other locations will see development, Allen said. He said the owners prefer not to disclose the exact locations until shipping operations start, by way of Grants Pass.

#### Chrome is used for stainless steel

and chrome plate, as in the motor industry, for light weight railroad cars, and smaller articles such as cooking utensils.

#### Allen emphasized that war-time

prices are not likely to be duplicated. He said there have been new discoveries of gigantic deposits in Brazil, New Caledonia, and the Philippines. The present price at Grants Pass amount to about \$12 a ton, he said.

#### "At present even high grade ore

is being mined and shipped either at a very small margin or at a loss to the company in order that operations may begin," he said. However, the future may hold some promise for large amounts of low grade ores.

#### Company operations are directed

toward Josephine and Curry counties in Oregon and Del Norte county in California, he said. Here "the great deposits of ore, but they have been largely unworked during the past two decades because of foreign competition.
