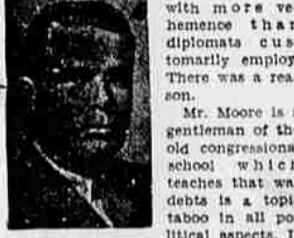

AMERICANS ENJOY FRIENDSHIP ERA SAYS ROOSEVELT

President Addresses Luncheon in Montevideo — Result of 1933 Conference Is Declared Inspirational

MONTEVIDEO, Dec. 3.—(AP)—President Roosevelt felt Montevideo late this afternoon aboard the cruiser Indianapolis for the trip back to the United States.

Addressing a luncheon given for him by President Gabriel Terra and Senora Terra after an enthusiastic reception by Montevideo's populace and officials, the United States executive declared:

"I believe that when history comes to be written the origin of the new American era will be placed here in the memorable year 1933.

"Truly, it is an inspiration for the average citizen of all our republics that the conference is giving back its fruits in terms of achievement for the people of the world."

"During the past week," Mr. Roosevelt said, "I have seen in the faces of the men, women and children of Rio de Janeiro, Buenos Aires and, today, in Montevideo, a joyful expression of hope and faith which can and will inspire us, their chosen representatives, to even greater activity in the common cause."

He expressed hope that President Terra and his wife would visit him and Mrs. Roosevelt in Washington. He had extended a similar invitation to President Augustin P. Justo of Argentina and Mrs. Justo during his visit in Buenos Aires for the opening of the Inter-American peace conference.

Thousands who lined the streets through which the two presidents drove showered flowers on the processions.

The United States president was to leave at 4 p. m. (2 p. m. E. S. T.) to start his journey northward.

He told President Terra and the others at the luncheon he had been "impressed with the immediate need for better and quicker services of travel and communication between North and South America."

"He hoped for the day," he said, when the journey "will be so simple that tens of thousands of our citizens will meet each other in friendly intercourse every year."

Angus Sutherland, resident of Southern Oregon for the past seven years, passed away north of Phoenix, Ore., at an early hour Thursday.

Mr. Sutherland was born in Pictou county, Nova Scotia, in 1850, and came to the United States in 1872. He landed in San Francisco, where he was naturalized in 1875. Mr. Sutherland had lived in many places in the United States, and was a fine plasterer. He helped plaster the original St. Francis hotel in San Francisco and many of the larger structures in Portland, Ore.

He was a member of Grand Lodge, Ancient Free and Accepted Masons of Nova Scotia, also a member of the Moose lodge of San Francisco. He leaves two adopted children, C. L. Sutherland of Medford, Ore., and Maude Sutherland of San Francisco. Funeral services in charge of the Per Funeral Home will be announced later.
