

SONS THESPIANS PLAN FIRST PLAY DECEMBER 10-12

ASHLAND—(Sp.)—The first play to be presented by the Southern Oregon Normal school this year is "The Late Christopher Bean," by Sidney Howard. This comedy was a tremendous success on Broadway and promises to furnish sparkling entertainment to Rogue river drama patrons on December 10 and 12.

Albert Van Aver, present head of the dramatic department, is directing the play. Mr. Van Aver, a student of literature and drama, is a graduate of Reed College. He received his master's degree from Claremont College, Claremont, California. While teaching during the last few years, he has worked for the doctorate at University of Iowa, and is about to

complete his work. As a student of the drama, Mr. Van Aver feels that "The Late Christopher Bean" is one of the most refreshing comedies written in this country in recent years.

The plot centers around a painter who had died in poverty. While alive he was considered a worthless drunkard, sponging off of everybody and able to draw anything but a salary. Before his death he had painted a number of pictures which everyone thought to be worthless but which later turned out to be worth a fortune. These were left in the attic of one, Haggitt, a country doctor who had befriended Bean when he was in hard straight. When Bean's paintings are suddenly acclaimed by the art critics as supremely great, one can well imagine the scramble that ensues to gain possession of Bean's works, and the pain experienced by Haggitt and his family when they learn the value of the pictures.

The leading masculine role, that of Doctor Haggitt, is played by John Barker, one of last year's Ashland high school graduates. Barker's interpretation of the role, under the guidance of Mr. Van Aver, promises to be up to professional standard.

The central feminine character, Abby, is played by Roberta Nourse, who has been seen in previous plays. She also is expected to provide a finished performance.

The rest of the characters are played by Genevieve Poff, Wynona Eklow, Norman Hamilton, Kenneth Burns, Jimmy Baughman, Laura Hughes, and LeRoy Clarke. Mr. Van Aver reports that all these people are displaying excellent dramatic ability. On the whole, the play will offer to the people of Ashland and Medford and to the surrounding communities two delightful evenings of entertainment.

The production staff includes Newell Monahan, stage manager; Rosella Kline, student director; Fremont East, assistant stage director; Esther Carter, prompter; Lucile Lambert, property manager; Connell Napier and Anita Feldman, costume designers; Rose Ragland, business manager; Bernard Applegate and Melvin Smith, publicity. The play production class is also aiding in stage work.

WIVES TO BOSS ERRING HUBBIES, JUDGE DECIDES

INDIANAPOLIS (UP)—Irresponsible husbands are going to have their tobacco and carfare doled out to them by responsible wives under new rules of Judge John P. Geckler of Marion county juvenile court.

In every future case, husbands who are found guilty of taking their wages "for a little spree" are going to be sentenced to take their pay checks home to their wives, Judge Geckler ruled.

"Of course, this kind of sentence will not be made unless the wife proves herself capable of handling the money."

The judge found that a large percent of the child neglect cases

brought into his court involved fathers who work on government relief projects.

"Some of this wholesale wasting of government work checks by husbands and fathers whose children are left in want is going to be stopped if this court has to resort to drastic measures to do it," he said.

Another serious problem threatening the welfare of children involved in juvenile court cases was found to be "the eternal triangle."

Judge Geckler arranged to handle that problem with the announcement:

"If there is evidence that a husband or wife is having an affair and the welfare of their children is at stake, I'll give one warning and then send the offender to jail."

Judge Geckler said he found "poverty and heredity" behind most juvenile cases.

"Inadequate homes due to poverty force the children to the streets and elsewhere for their recreation and they eventually end up in court here," he said.

"Also, juvenile delinquency is found among children whose parents lack the proper mental training."

PROPOSE HOSTEL AT CAMP SAVAGE

Proposing that Camp Savage near Grants Pass be the first of a west coast chain of "youth-hostels," James Mullins yesterday presented preliminary plans for the project to Grants Pass Rotarians.

Youth hostels, through which young hikers and cyclists are furnished cheap, clean and supervised overnight lodgings, had their inception in Europe and have recently spread to New England states.

Monroe Smith, leader of the movement in this country, visited Grants Pass last week-end and conferred with local residents as to feasibility of the plan.

The hostels are located within easy hiking distance of each other in scenic regions. Mullins said that trips to Crater lake and other southern Oregon attractions had sold the hos-

tel supporters on creation of a chain here.

One chain of 76 farmhouse and woods camp hostels in New England has been formed and another is being started in the Chicago area.
