

FORUM TO DISCUSS BAN ON INFERIOR IMPORT PRODUCE

Protection of Oregon growers against importation of inferior products from adjoining states will be discussed at a luncheon-meeting to be held in the Hotel Medford next Monday under sponsorship of the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce agricultural committee, W. E. Morris, Table Rock rancher, is chairman of the sub-committee.

Those invited to the forum-luncheon include members of the agricultural committee of the chambers of commerce in Ashland, Grants Pass, Roseburg, Marshfield, Klamath Falls and Lakeview.

"Prohibiting entrance of inferior products would be beneficial to the whole state because Oregon money which is now going out of the state would be kept and spent in the state," Mr. Morris said.

"We are not in any way criticizing the state agriculture department," Mr. Morris emphasized. "With the appropriations at their disposal they are doing an excellent job and really accomplishing more than their fund allotments would indicate. We feel, however, that Oregon's \$16,000,000 industry is worth protecting to the fullest extent."

The prohibition of inferior products was proposed some time ago by the chamber of commerce and its suggestion was immediately approved by the Portland Chamber of Commerce. W. B. D. Dodson, executive vice president of the Portland Chamber of Commerce, D. C. is said to be keenly interested in the proposition.

Bank Clearings In Heavy Volume

NEW YORK, Dec. 4.—(AP)—Bank clearings in 22 leading cities totaled \$6,153,176,000 during the five-day week ended December 2, Dun & Bradstreet reported today.

This was a gain of 13.1 percent over \$5,442,401,000 in the same five-day week a year ago. Last week clearings were 10.3 percent ahead of the 1935 comparative.

At New York City clearings aggregated \$4,094,170,000, or 14.6 percent better than in the same week last year. The total at outside centers of \$2,059,006,000 was an increase of 10.2 percent.

POOR FARM HEAD TO DECIDE ON CHICKENS

PINT SIZE OVENS BLAMED FOR DIP IN TURKEY PRICE

SALT LAKE CITY, Dec. 4.—(AP)—Midget ovens in the nation's apartment houses were blamed today for a slump in turkey prices.

"Housewives want nothing larger than 16-pounders," sighed Herbert Beyers, general manager of the Northwestern Turkey Growers' association. "Half the turkey crop this year has been dropped 8 to 10 cents a pound for Thanksgiving. The big broilers simply won't fit into the 'half-pint' ovens in modern kitchens."

Hence, Beyers advised growers: "Market only small and well-fitted birds for Christmas."

Beyers said retailers reported profits from Thanksgiving sales that he estimated far exceeded average consumption—housewives taking advantage of bargain prices and increased production.

Growers went "into the red," he said, due to lack of demand for the gangling, heavy type of turkeys.

Beyers declined to guess on Christmas prices. "Prospect for a profitable market are unsatisfactory," he said, "unless the growers hold back larger and undeveloped birds."

He estimated half of the nation's turkey crop of 25,000,000 was sold for Thanksgiving.

PORTLAND MECCA FOR AIR MINDED

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 4.—(AP)—Portland's Swan Island airport will be the mecca for airplanes from all parts of the nation today and Saturday during sessions of the northwest aviation planning council, Harry K. Coffey, chairman of the program committee, said today.

A special transport plane will come from St. Paul, Minn., an army bomber will bring federal aviation chiefs from Washington, D. C. and another will arrive from San Rafael, Calif., and cabin planes will be piloted by private owners from many western cities, including Seattle and Yakima.

Mayor Joseph K. Carson welcomed delegates at an 8:30 breakfast today. Brigadier General H. H. Arnold, assistant chief of the army's aviation division, will speak at the Saturday night banquet.

TURKEY SHOW AT OAKLAND DEC. 8-12

Greater interest is being taken by some of the turkey growers of the Rogue River valley in the northwest turkey show to be held at Oakland December 8 to 12. Already 60 entries have been made from the neighborhood of Grants Pass and Rogue River.

Sixteen firms at Grants Pass have raised a special prize fund of \$100 to be offered to the growers of their district. This has been the largest turkey show in the world for four years, last year with a total entry of over 1200 birds.

Live show judges are Harry M. Lamson of Adams Center, N. Y., and H. P. Griffin of Salt Lake City.

Dressed show judges will be F. E. Fox of Oregon State College and M. H. Shook of Roseburg. Between seven and eight hundred different premiums and trophies are offered the ambitious turkey exhibitor.

CAPITOL EXTENSION DEPENDS ON FUNDS

BAKER, Dec. 4.—(AP)—Senator W. H. Strayer, Baker county Democrat, said possible legislative action to expand Oregon's still unconstructed state capital would depend upon other demands for funds when the lawmakers meet at Salem next month.

"A lot of things may drain away our money," said the senator. He commented on reports the legislature would be asked to provide money for a state library.

"There is talk about reducing the old age assistance law limit from 70 to 65 years. Also, the members will have a lot of bills calling for appropriations."

AMERICAN MALES GULLIBLE IN LOVE, AVERS CAVALIERI

ROME (UP)—Lina Cavalieri, who rose from a flower girl on the streets of Rome to be the toast of Moscow, Paris and New York, believes the American is the most gullible in love, "as in everything else, except love."

But she admits he is a dynamo in force.

In her memoirs being published in Italy, the woman once acclaimed as the world's greatest beauty has much to say about men and how to be beautiful. She once married an American and divorced him a week later.

An Englishman to Lina Cavalieri loves with a book of etiquette in one hand, she says he makes a good companion, and a courteous friend. But, she doesn't laugh, he only smiles, he doesn't eat, he nourishes himself, he doesn't love, he merely makes a home for a woman.

The Italian, she says, is a dreamer, he is intelligent, but jealous and irresponsible.

The Frenchman is more practical, according to Lina Cavalieri. Love is a pleasant auxiliary in his life. The former beauty is 62 now, but she still retains her youthful appearance.

"My secret is simple," she says. "I get up at 6 every morning and take a long walk before breakfast. I never stay up after 10 at night."

"Women sleep too much. They would be healthier if they slept eight hours and no more. They shouldn't let their beds lure them for every small illness," she said.

Better looking than most women at 40, Lina Cavalieri reminisced in an interview.

"Stage life taught me to preserve my body. And I believe beauty is to feminine success what cowchwork is to an automobile."

Her theory about food is simple, although unorthodox.

"Once I was the victim of my food. I could not eat strawberries, sardines and other things because I was subject to nettle rash. One bite and my body would break out with it until I became tired of this and decided that if I was to suffer anyway I would eat what I liked. From that day I've eaten what I liked, according to my appetite, within limits. The curious part of it is that I never have been troubled with nettle rash since."

She eats few dishes with quantities of vegetables, fruits and tomatoes. Evenings she eats a light dinner.

On beauty Lina Cavalieri says: "Women should never let their skins become dry. When this happens beauty begins to fade. Even now, when I am no longer young, I rub my entire body with glycerine every night. And every morning I cleanse all grease from it. That's all."

Lina Cavalieri began life as a flower girl, rose to be a Russian pitonesse, won fame for her beauty and jewels, and was a celebrated opera singer, often accompanying Caruso.

At the sunset of her glamorous life she decided to describe her life in memoirs.

"I wanted to relive old memories by writing them," she said.

"In my book I have told about the squallor of my childhood home and of the triumphs I later achieved in art. My fame as a beauty was only incidental because my beauty was a gift I held in trust."

"But I've not told everything," she added with a smile. "Certain tender memories are too sacred to reveal."

Today I am no longer young nor a great beauty, no longer Princess Lantchka Bariatinsky, no longer fabulously rich. My memories are all I possess, you see, and I have wanted to keep just a few for myself alone."

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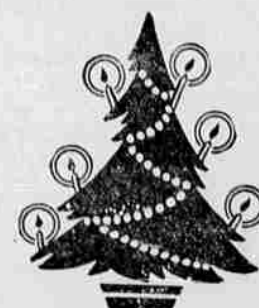
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
