

HEAVY PENALTIES BOLSTER GOERING FOUR-YEAR PLAN

Death Decreed for Germans Who Hoard Wealth Abroad — Government to Train Children for Nazism

BERLIN, Dec. 3.—(AP)—The "brass knuckle" policy of Gen. Hermann Wilhelm Goering's four-year plan for the rehabilitation of Germany was implemented today by a series of far-reaching laws and drastic penalties.

"The death penalty for economic sabotage" and a law for the "accelerated exploitation of Germany's mineral resources" were regarded the most important decrees promulgated by the cabinet yesterday.

The cabinet acted swiftly with Reichsfuehrer Adolf Hitler presiding.

Death for Hoarders
The "economic sabotage" law, decreeing death for Germans who "unscrupulously" hoard wealth abroad and "damage the German economy," strengthened recent edicts demanding deposits of German-held foreign securities.

It also filled a gap in a decree making it compulsory to register all property owned abroad by Germans, which only announced a "heavy punishment" for violation.

Yesterday's decree became a new threat against violators of recent injunctions which put within reach of the government between 1,500,000,000 and 2,000,000,000 marks (\$800,000,000 to \$850,000,000) which could be converted into foreign currencies should the necessity arise.

Relax to Train Young
"Other laws decreed included: Incorporation of every German boy and girl, without exception in the Hitler youth movement, "physically, spiritually and morally."

Catholic circles were alarmed over the youth control law, designed to perpetuate nazism in future generations. Literally interpreted, it gave the youth organization a monopoly on all training outside the home and school and left in doubt the future of religious education.

Find Underwater Cavern
THE DALLAS, Ore., Dec. 4.—(AP)—An underwater cavern in the basalt bluff on the Columbia river west of this city presented an unexpected problem to contractors for the \$18,000 port of The Dalles oil dock today. It was expected divers would explore the cavern before work started.

WED WHILE YOUNG AND SHUN IN-LAWS PARSON'S ADVICE

Man Who Has Performed 800 Marriages and Made Most of Them Stick Explains Successful Method

NEW YORK, Dec. 4.—(UP)—Marry young and don't live with your in-laws, was the formula given today by the Rev. Paul M. Spencer, the "marrying parson" of the Church of the Strangers, a bachelor who has performed 800 wedding ceremonies and made most of them stick by his unique follow-up method.

The Rev. Spencer had just finished his yearly lecture at the "Bride and Groom" ceremony—an annual gathering of persons whom he had married in the little church on West 37th street. Divorces are so rare among his followers that he had to dig back into dog-eared books to find what he calls "a tragedy."

Many Write
Two hundred persons attended the ceremony this year, and there came letters from all over the country saying things like "Sorry we can't make it this year" and "the baby is teething" and "business is keeping us here." Nevertheless, it was a jolly occasion with everybody having sandwiches, coffee and cake. Spencer had married everybody in the room—bachelors, organists, choir singers and those who had just come to visit.

Spencer philosophized on marriage and explained his technique.

"It is hard to lay down general rules about successful marriage, but I will try," he said.

"Don't marry until you have enough money to live comfortably. Love has got to have something green to live on."

"Have your own home if it's only one room. Under no circumstances should young people live with their in-laws."

"Marry young if you can afford it, because that allows you to adjust

your lives to each other before it's too late."

Advise Patrons

Spencer writes an average of 40 letters a week to persons whom he has married, advising them on financial matters, family quarrels and the set-up of the home. His mail is heavy, and sometimes people travel to New York especially to consult him.

The Church of the Strangers belongs to no denomination and its primary purpose is to welcome lonely people to New York. It was founded during the Civil war as a

place where southerners—then ostracized in the north—could meet, have social affairs and worship. Its doors are always open and Spencer spends much of his time talking with strangers.

Asked why he had never married himself, Spencer replied: "I am too

busy marrying nice girls to other people."

Naturalization Fails

PENDLETON, Dec. 4.—(AP)—Ben Rose, barber, was released today on \$250 bail after he pleaded guilty to a charge of giving false testimony in obtaining American citizenship. At a naturalization hearing, Rose testified that he had not been convicted of a criminal charge. But District Attorney C. G. Proebstel has received information that he served a penitentiary sentence under the name of D. A. Galyarde.
