

SALVATION ARMY KETTLES APPEAR HERE TOMORROW

In harmony with the spirit of the local Christmas opening, the Salvation Army will open its annual appeal for funds for its Christmas relief program by placing upon the streets of Medford tomorrow the red tripods and green pots with their signs which urge the passing public to "Keep the pot boiling."

Year after year it is the intention of the army, in every city in which it operates, to see that not one needy family or person goes without a Christmas dinner with all the fixings on Christmas day. The Army depends almost entirely upon the money received in the Christmas Kettles for this purpose, the only supplement being the supplies such as canned fruits and vegetables which are sent to the Army's Christmas headquarters by generous housewives.

Christmas headquarters of the Army will be located at 236 North Bartlett street, phone 356, and supplies of all kinds, suitable for placement in the baskets, will be gratefully received.

The Army will be glad to call at homes for such supplies when notified by phone.

Captain G. R. Durham, commanding officer, stated that the Army is now prepared to receive the names of needy families and asks that each citizen co-operate by sending in the names of families in their community, about which they know, who are actually in need of assistance. Salvationists standing at the kettles will gladly take the names of such families.

ANSWER TO GORE SUIT AMENDED BY COUNTY

An amended answer, enlarging upon the "statute of limitations" phase of Jackson county's contentions in the suit filed by W. H. Gore for collection of approximately \$88,000, assertedly due for services rendered in connection with the passage by congress in 1926 of the Oregon-California land grant tax refund bill, was filed yesterday by the district attorney's office. Trial of the case is set for next Wednesday.

The contentions of the county that no contract existed between it and Gore; that all payments made to Gore were "donations in gratitude" and not for services; and that the plaintiff "lobbied" in behalf of the measure are unchanged.

FOREST SERVICE DEVELOPS LAND FOR PUBLIC USE

The following bulletin was issued today by the Rogue river national forest service:

"It is estimated that the number of visitors on the Rogue river national forest this year increased approximately 60 percent over that of last year. To meet this growing demand for recreational facilities, the energies of a large portion of the South Fork and Applegate CCC camps as well as the E. R. A. camp have been devoted to this work.

"These projects consist of planting fish, cleaning up camp grounds to reduce fire hazard, construction of rustic stone camp stoves and rustic log tables, sanitation conveniences, boat docks, floats, swimming pools, bath houses, water systems, camp ground roads and community kitchen or picnic centers.

"At Lake of the Woods the Aspen Point campground now contains 21 individual camps, each having running water, stone camp stove, log table and a tent site. In this same area to the Willow Springs campground were added seven new individual camps. Near the Lake of the Woods resort have been constructed a new boat dock with two floats and a camp with a double stove and 12 tables for the larger picnic.

"At Fish Lake the same type of community kitchen with a fire-place and tables have been constructed as well as eight individual camps. At Union creek 29 new individual camps were added to the already existing community kitchen. At the McKee bridge on the Applegate a swimming pool, bath house, six stoves and 14 tables have been constructed. At Sulphur Springs up the Beaver road a swimming pool and five camp stoves and ten tables have been built.

"At Wrangle Gap on the Siskiyou loop drive a community kitchen with a fire place, two stoves and two individual camps have been constructed. At the Cook and Green camp three stoves and six tables have been built. At the Trail camp on the Siskiyou loop drive a novice ski run, a toboggan run, three professional ski runs and a shelter with stoves have been provided for winter sports.

"In addition to this the Dead Indian Soda Springs camp with the community kitchen, tables and individual camp was completed last spring.

"During the summer in cooperation with the U. S. bureau of hatcheries and the state game commission, the forest service planted about 300,000

trout in the streams and lakes throughout the forest.

"All of this work has but one aim—to make it possible for the public more completely to enjoy the Rogue river national forest during the coming season."
