Walter Huston heads the cast of the screen version of Sinclair Lewis' "Dodsworth" which opens a three-day run at the Holly theater today. With him in the cast are Ruth Chatterton, Paul Lukas, Mary Astor, David Niven and several of the players who were featured in the stage play. Huston again plays the title role of Sam Dodsworth, the easy-going American husband, in which he scored such a hit in the two-year run of the play. Miss Carpenter has the part of Fran, the pretty, frivolous, selfish wife whom he adores. The story opens when hard-working, successful Sam Dodsworth retires to travel and enjoy his first taste of leisure. But to his wife, Fran, Europe means one last fling as a romance before settling down to middle-age.

The couple sail on the Queen Mary. Fran has her first flirtation aboard ship. NORTHWEST WOOL TRADING AT END

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 5.—(AP)—A virtual cessation of wool trading in the northwest after growers sold approximately 50,000,000 pounds, mostly in Texas, occurred in northwest markets within the past week, market sources said.

The major transaction reported was the sale by the Hislop Sheep company, Spokane, of 30,000 fleeces of lambs' wool to the Pendleton woolen mills at 32 cents. In the Lakeview section, where prices recently reached 33 cents, quotations had fallen off to 30 cents.
