

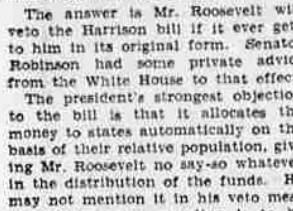

 WASHINGTON, April 15.—Speakers nearly fell out of the senate gallery when Floor Leader Robinson fought against Finance Leader Harrison's bill for a \$300,000,000 annual federal education subsidy. It was as if Damon had struck Pythias.



Administration senators could not ascertain which leader to follow, as both are supposed to represent what ever President Roosevelt wants. The answer is Mr. Roosevelt will veto the Harrison bill if it ever gets to him in its original form. Senator Robinson had some private advice from the White House to that effect. The president's strongest objection to the bill is that it allocates the money to states automatically on the basis of their relative population, giving Mr. Roosevelt no say-so whatever in the distribution of the funds. He may not mention it in his veto message, but it is the trouble he is to be done, Mr. Roosevelt wants to do it. After all, the people might just as well elect a Republican president if they are going to get their share of the federal loot automatically and not from the presidential hand.
