30,000 CASES PEARS CANNED IN MEDFORD FOR WIDE SHIPMENT

In connection with the activities of Pear Week announcement was made today that the Rogue River Valley Canning Co. here, canned and sold approximately 30,000 cases of Bartlett pears, all grown in this valley.

These pears were shipped all over the middle west and to England, where the Crater Lake label with its blue lake picture is a sight far from uncommon on grocery shelves.

In fact the quality of the locally packed pears is so well thought of that when the initial shipment of the 1936 pack reached the shelves of the famous Richelle brand, Sprague Warner & company in Chicago, that firm promptly sent out and purchased all the canned pears that were unsold. There is no surplus of Medford canned pears.

Rogue River Valley Canning Co. has recently secured a copyright on the trade mark "Medford" brand, which will carry the name to a wide area.

X-Ray Movie Camera LONDON (UP)—An X-ray camera which will take moving pictures has been perfected by a British radiologist.
