REPORT SKETCHES CHAMBER ACTIVITY DURING PAST YEAR... President Arnsperger Gives Summary of Work Under Grouping of Committees - Outside Aid Is Noted

Directors of the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce held in their possession today the annual summary report of the president, Olen Arnsperger. The report reviews briefly the work of the chamber in the past year. Mr. Arnsperger summarizing the activities under committee groupings.

The president emphasized that the report could only skim over the highlights of the year's program and indicated that detailed committee reports would be available later.

For this assistance in various chapters of the National Aeronautic Association, Mr. Arnsperger expressed appreciation for his help in advancing the chamber's aviation program.

Freight Rates Watched. Transportation committee - Kept closely in touch with freight rates and other matters of transportation at all times. The manager of the chamber of commerce was elected chairman of the Oregon Transportation league, which was organized at the request of Gov. Charles H. Martin.

Aviation and Military Affairs Committee-Cooperated with United Air Lines in all matters pertaining to air mail and commercial aviation. Co-operated with visiting army and navy groups. Submitted application for a chapter of the National Aeronautic Association in Medford.

County Publicized. Published ten thousand pamphlets. Conducted broadcasts every day from the chamber of commerce office. Maintained a sign board at West in addition to the articles and pictures were sent to hundreds of magazines and newspapers during the year.

Tourist committee-Conducted a meeting of all southern Oregon communities and as a result ideas and suggestions were obtained which will be used as the basis of a tourist program. Organized a county council for the Shasta-Cascade-Wonderland association.

General Activity Cited. Civic and General Work-Cooperated closely with the civilian conservation corps and the blaster rust control. Organized a junior activities committee to work with the school authorities. Conducted a program in connection with national fire prevention week. Assisted in the reorganizing of the Grater club. Conducted continuous "Let's Quit Killing" campaign, and cooperated with the "Martyrs and Montgomery Ward" for their safety school, conducted here. Carried out a "trade at home" program. Instituted an Americanization program and donated flags to schools who showed the best registration of parents for the various elections. Assisted the Southern Oregon Agricultural Station in its program and exhibits. Co-operated with the Central Point "deafification contest." Conducted secretaryship of the Jackson county planning commission. Assisted in organizing a mineral and gem society.

TRAILER TOURISTS TO FIND WELCOME IN ROGUE FOREST... Parking Space Provided at Campgrounds - Public Is Invited to Use Recreational, Outdoor Facilities

When the expected trailer-house tourist horde starts rolling along the highways this summer, the Rogue river national forest will have a welcome sign at many of its campgrounds.

Always abreast of the times, forest executives have taken cognizance of the growing popularity of trailer-house travel. They have provided special parking accommodations for the covered wagons of the 20th century at 18 campgrounds. Other forest camps are being improved to provide for them also.

So the tourists who travel around the country leisurely in their commodious trailer-houses will find all the outdoor recreational facilities open to them, with fish-laden streams, enticing forest trails and gorgeous scenery to induce them to tarry awhile in southern Oregon.

Conservation is Aim. While the forests are being developed into healthful recreational centers for the free use of the public, the building of campground areas is only an incident in the broad program of conservation, executive point out. That program includes conservation of timber, prevention of fires, floods and soil erosion, eradication of plant and animal diseases, protection of wildlife and watersheds and the building up of grazing lands. It has been found, however, that conservation can best be served by proper use of the forest areas. Hence attractive campgrounds are constructed and the public is invited to use them.

Tabulations show that last year 127,000 persons passed through the Rogue river national forest, 32,000 of whom carried one day or more at the forest camp.

Campgrounds equipped for the accommodation of trailer-houses may be found at Annapolis Creek, Aspen Point, Beaver Sulphur, Soda Spring, Furewell Bend, Fish Lake, Hamaker, Huckleberry, McKee Bridge, Muir Creek, Natusinnes Bridge, North Butte, South Butte, South Fork, Spruce, Union Creek, Willow Creek and Wraggle Gap.

Additional improved camp grounds are maintained at Abbot Prairie, Alkali, Bear, Beaver Dam, Big Bear, Buck Lake, Bunoh Grass, Carberry, Cherry Creek, Coon Crane Creek, Crater Creek, Foster Creek, Ginko division, Grassy Spring, Hole in Ground, Huckleberry Gap, Innahs, Jack Spring, Lake Harriet, Log Pine, Long Prairie, National Creek, Nicholls, Odessa, Parker Meadows, Rainbow, Rogue Head, Seven-Mile, Snow Shoe, Star Gulch, Sunday, Trail Camp, Union Creek ski run (for winter sports), Upper South Fork, Wagon, Wickup Spring, Woodruff Creek, Woodruff Spring, Yale Creek, Cook-Green and Hutton.

The campgrounds range in development up to those having complete facilities for the accommodation of large parties of picnickers, including shelters, tables, community kitchens, ablives and even playgrounds for children. All the camps have sanitary facilities and provisions are usually found for swimming and diving whenever the camp is situated on a stream or lake where it is safe to indulge in these sports.

GERMANY IS WILLING TO JOIN IN PARLEY...
