As disabled veterans of the World war in hospitals and workrooms in all parts of the country are making poppies to be worn in memory of their fallen comrades on Poppy Day in May, school children throughout the United States are putting the finishing touches to the poppies they are submitting for the poppy poster contest. Perhaps the general public is unaware that Medford has considerable talent among pupils in the art department of the public schools.

One of the pupils of the Medford school department won state renown in the contest conducted by the American Legion auxiliary last year. He was rewarded with a cash prize from the Medford unit of the auxiliary as well as a larger cash prize from the state department of the auxiliary.

Another poppy poster contest is in progress and Medford unit is waiting anxiously to see how many more honors will be awarded this year. This local contest closes around May 1. State honors will be awarded during the convention in Albany this summer. An national honors will be awarded in September at New York City.

Did you know that the American Legion was the first national organization to adopt the poppy as its memorial flower, having taken this action at the national convention in Cleveland, September 27 to 29, 1920. This is particularly fitting as the American Legion is a World war organization only and the poppy is a flower that blooms abundantly on the battlefields of France where the sons of the World war were principally laid and where so many of our men had fallen in battle.

All musical associations in the city are urged to take part in this week of musical entertainment by the co-chairmen.

Every effort will be made to give all music lovers of this community a chance to hear the best music available during this week.
