**DAFFODIL FESTIVAL QUEEN**



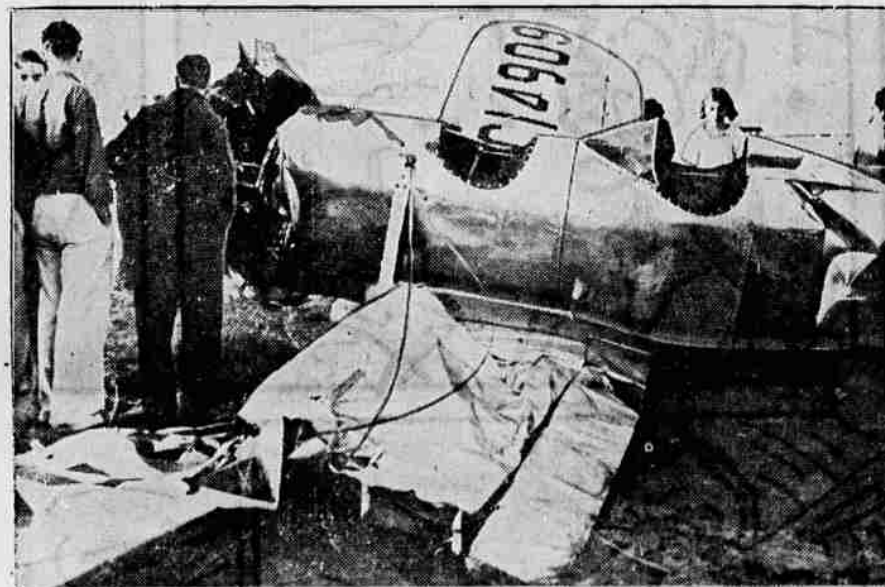

**CABALLERO INSPECTS OUTPOST**



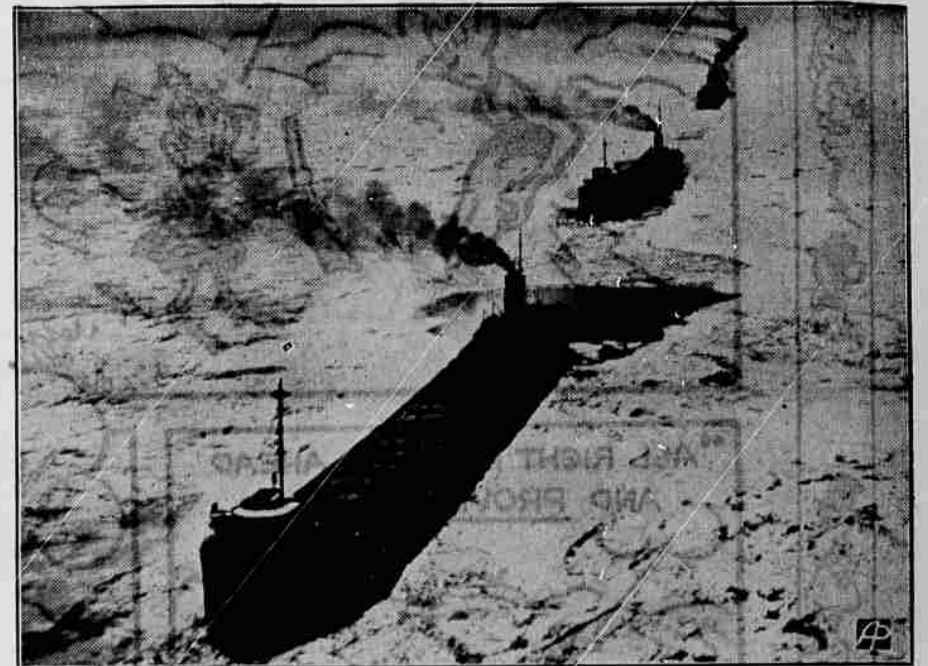

**Lake Ships Battle Ice as Spring Arrives**



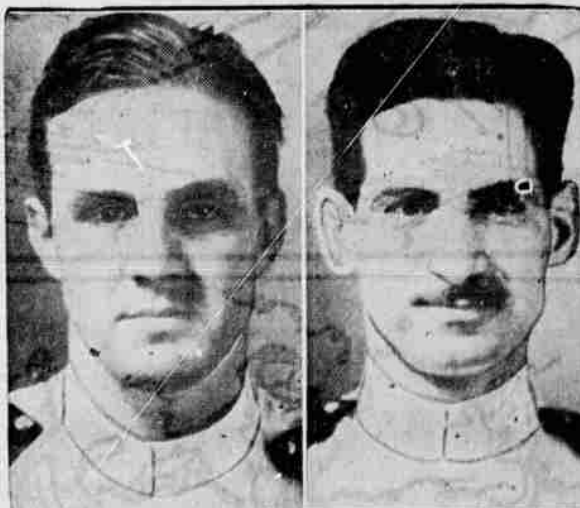

**Suspect Arrested**



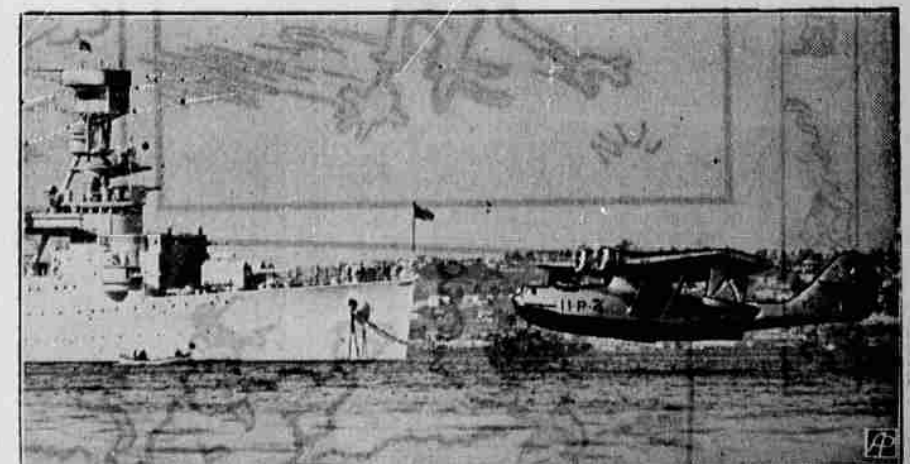
