

SPANISH CITIZEN TELLS CONDITIONS IN NATIVE LAND

In an informal and private talk before members of the American Association of University Women here Saturday, Jose Pedrosa, Spanish citizen traveling in the United States, presented his views on the present Spanish civil war.

As a member of what is commonly termed the rebel party, Pedrosa condemned the defending government party as attempting to impose a communistic dictatorship on Spain. The speaker stressed he represents no party or faction and the purpose of his visit to the United States is to look after private business interests. He makes no public appearances.

Pedrosa explained events leading up to the rebellion, claiming that the present government is made up of extreme leftists, anarchists, communists and republicans and that their purpose is to set up a proletarian dictatorship.

The speaker described the period between February 16 and June 20 of 1936, immediately preceding the rebellion, as one of terrorism propagated by government powers during which churches were burned and hundreds murdered.

Refuting the charge of fascism as applied to the rebel faction, Pedrosa stated that although it is true his party adopted a few fascist tendencies in order to defend themselves against the extremist government, true fascists make up a very small minority of the group. He stated that citizens having the true interest of their country at heart make up the rebelling party, no matter what their political or religious tag may be.
