

### 3 PLEAD GUILTY, SENTENCING DUE IN COMING WEEK

Passing of sentence upon three defendants, who entered pleas of guilty this morning, was continued until next week by Circuit Judge H. D. Norton.

### DEATH HOUSE SCENES PICTURED IN SERMON AT SALVATION ARMY

Speaking on "The Word of God," Brigadier Francis Howell, Salvation Army evangelist now conducting meetings at the local corps, last evening described some of his experiences while chaplain in San Quentin prison. "I talked one morning," he said, "with 13 men in the death house. All of them were young men. "Entering the 13th cell I saw a young man pacing back and forth seemingly in deep agony of soul. In his hands he held an open Bible. He told me his story and finished by saying, 'Oh, if only I had known about the word of God before I committed this terrible crime. I could have been saved from a life of crime and would never have come to such a tragic death.'"

### NO LIE DETECTOR FOR ACCUSED PAIR

ROSEBURG, Ore., April 30.—(AP)—Plans to submit Mr. and Mrs. Leonard Hopkins of Canyonville, charged with involuntary manslaughter in connection with the death of the former's four-year-old daughter, to a lie detector test, were cancelled late yesterday. Failure of district attorney and defense counsel to agree upon terms demanded by Ray B. Compton, representing Mr. and Mrs. Hopkins, was given by Sheriff Percy Webb as the reason for calling off arrangements for the examination, scheduled for Saturday. District Attorney J. V. Long, it was reported, refused to comply with Compton's demand that evidence secured by means of the lie detector should not be admissible in court and that results of the examination not be made public. Compton had previously declared that he would not permit his clients to be examined through use of the equipment unless such stipulation should be made.

### COURIERS OF NAVY WANT TRAVEL AID

WASHINGTON—(AP)—It will take an act of congress to keep the navy's secrets good as it safe. And the navy is trying to get congress to pass the act. It's this way: Naval officers are forbidden to take compartments in Pullmans because the expense is greater than necessary. At the same time, an officer charged with handling secret documents is likely to lose his commission if he loses the documents. Therefore, he has to take a berth and stay awake because he can't lock it. The navy department's new bill contains a specific clause allowing "confidential couriers" of the navy to take lockable train compartments on cross-country trips.

### LONGEVITY SECRET SEEN IN RED HAIR

"The five redheads still are alive, but my five other children, who were dark haired, died young or in middle age."

Her husband, dark-haired, died 28 years ago. Her oldest son, T. A. Wormer, of Denver, is 82 and her youngest, Charles G. Wormer of Spokane, Wash., is 60. Mrs. Wormer, whose red hair now is streaked with gray, weighs 60 pounds and is four feet tall. She is in good health, but hard of hearing. "I have seen any changes in the mechanical and scientific world during my life time," she said. "All have made life faster and lessened work. But despite the new ways of amusing one's self, I still cling to soli-

taire, the same recreation I enjoyed 75 years ago while waiting for my husband to return from the Civil war.
