

# Norma Shearer and Leslie Howard In "Romeo and Juliet" Here Today

## BRILLIANT CAST SUPPORTS STARS IN FAMOUS PLAY

Norma Shearer as Juliet Leslie Howard as Romeo. The most beloved romance ever written, "Romeo and Juliet," penned by William Shakespeare, opens a three day run today at the New Craterian theatre, shown exactly as it was presented in its many roadshow engagements throughout the country.

And, said to be most magnificent of all, is the duel in which Basil Rathbone slays John Barrymore and is in turn killed by Leslie Howard. The story, an exciting adventure in the lives of Juliet and her Romeo, their meeting, their eager, desperate love for each other, the swift dramatic events that follow, causing Romeo's banishment and their final reunion, is one that has stood the test of time and is today still one of the most widely read.
