

MEDFORD DISTRICT LOSES TWO CAMPS IN SUMMER SHIFT

Medford OOC district will lose two companies in routine summer shifts, it was announced today by Maj. Geo. R. Owens, district commander. The change will leave the district with 23 camps and headquarters detachment for the summer period, he said.

Co. 2110, Camp Brice Creek, will move to Camp Canyon Creek in eastern Oregon, a Vancouver Barracks district camp.

Co. 544, Camp Prairie Creek, will move to Camp Canyon in the Yellowstone national park.

Four companies are moving within the district. Co. 3879, Camp Coos Head, has already moved to Camp Lava Beds, in the Lava Beds national monument.

Co. 3870, Camp Rand, will move to Camp Diamond Lake. Co. 3873, Camp Oregon Caves, will move to Camp Annie Spring in the Crater Lake national park. Co. 3884, Camp Prescott, will move to Camp Wineglass, also in Crater Lake national park.

JUDGE OVERRULES VERDICT FOR TIME

NEW YORK, May 6. —(AP)— Although a supreme court jury today returned a verdict for Time Magazine, Inc. in the \$250,000 libel suit brought by Curtis B. Dell, former son-in-law of President Roosevelt, Justice Bernard L. Sweeney set the verdict aside on motion of Dell's counsel.

"The verdict of the jury is against the overwhelming evidence," Justice Sweeney said.

"The plaintiff clearly established a deliberate libel. To allow the verdict to stand would be a travesty on justice, and I have no hesitancy in setting it aside."

Dell based his suit on an article published in the April 23, 1934, issue of "Time." The article, described by the defense at the trial as "an imaginative illustration," told the imagined "suicide" of Dell in the White House in the presence of his former wife and Mrs. Roosevelt.
