SOMETHING QUEER SIGHTED ON MARS

LOS ANGELES, May 7.—(AP)—Astronomers say something curious apparently is happening on the planet Mars.

Nightly studies recently at Griffith observatory have disclosed what seem to be one immense and several smaller storms on the planet—possibly dust storms, bigger and worse than those which have afflicted mid-west America.

One supposed storm made itself apparent as a vast, hazy patch, estimated at 1000 miles long and 300 wide, near the equator of Mars.

TEACHERS MOLD GUIDE TO HELP PUPILS SLOW IN REGULAR SUBJECTS
