**Road Still Closed—**Diamond Lake highway is still closed to traffic from the junction with Crater Lake highway. Although the highway is passable to the Rogue river bridge, the bureau of public roads is engaged in maintenance work on the 2 1/2-mile stretch and motorists are discouraged from trying to drive to the bridge. "Closed" signs are still stretched across the highway at the junction.

The blanks, when properly filled out, may be mailed directly to the secretary of state's office in Salem or delivered to Mr. McReynolds who will mail them and issue an official receipt for the fee. \$1. 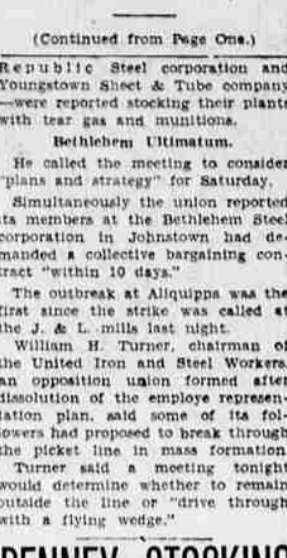
