Insurance Company
Ban Ordered Lifted
SALEM, Ore., May 13.—(AP)—Circuit Judge L. H. McMahan of Marion county set aside the order revoking the insurance license of the Rodgers-Hart-Banks Co. and ordered Insurance Commissioner Hugh H. Earle to renew the company's license upon payment of \$50 fine.
Earle refused to renew the license of the 40-year-old firm in Portland April 27 because it allegedly placed insurance with unlicensed companies, particularly London Lloyds, which is prohibited under Oregon laws from doing business within the state. The company appealed from the revocation.
