## HOOD RIVER AGREES TO BATTLE TIGERS HERE ON OCTOBER 2

Hood River high school's football team will meet Medford's Red and Black Tornado in Medford October 2. Coach Bill Bowerman announced today following contract negotiations between the two schools. The Tigers will journey to Hood River in 1938. With the signing of the powerful eastern Oregon squad, the Medford schedule was increased to seven games, with one more game to be arranged with an undetermined team.

Medford's three southern Oregon conference battles—Ashland, Grants Pass and Klamath Falls—will all be played away from home. Teams appearing here will be, in addition to Hood River, Bend and Eugene, the latter battle to be staged Thanksgiving day. Bend will play here October 30.

Roseburg will be met at Roseburg, and to add one more game to the home slate, Coach Bowerman has written several strong teams.

ANGELES CAMP, Cal., May 13.—(AP)—The entry committee of the annual Jumping Frog Jubilee today ruled out Pegasus, one of the Golden Gate International exposition's entries, because he has six legs.

The committee held this might give Pegasus an unfair advantage—like equipping Johnny Weismuller with an outboard motor in a swimming race.

At the jubilee here next Saturday and Sunday frogs entered from three continents will compete to determine which can jump the farthest. The jubilee was suggested by Mark Twain's famous early California story, "The Jumping Frog of Calaveras."

## 16 ATHLETES CHOSEN AT MEDFORD HIGH FOR MEET IN GRANTS PASS

Sixteen Medford high track and field athletes will go into action Saturday afternoon at Grants Pass in the annual state district meet which is expected to draw more than 100 entries from schools in six counties.

Winners of first and second places will be qualified to enter the state track and field meet in Eugene May 21 and 22, and Coach Bill Bowerman stated that all Medford performers qualifying would be taken to the northern affair.

As a result of time trials held yesterday afternoon, Coach Bowerman announced today the team he would send into action Saturday. In the high hurdles, Bowman and Luther will perform, with Hill and Bowman entering the low hurdles. Stinger and Crosby will compete in the century; Crosby and Childers in the 220; Linnell and Abbott in the 440; and Chris Barker in the mile.

Jack Hill and Doty will enter the pole vault; Horner and Newlin the broad jump; Bowman the javelin; Grow the shotput; Grow and Howard the discus and four of the following six the relay: Hill, Stinger, Crosby, Linnell, Bowman and Childers.

Teams from Klamath, Lake, Jackson, Coos and Curry counties will be entered. Those counties compose state track district 3. Two entries in each of the 14 events will be allowed each school.

Marvin K. Hedge, national long distance fly casting champion in 1934, will be in Medford tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock, according to a wire received by Al Piche. He will give free instruction to all anglers who bring their own rods to the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce at that time.

Hedge was here several months ago, demonstrating his skill and giving instruction, and a large number of local fly-fishermen are expected to take advantage of the opportunity tomorrow to receive lessons from one of the finest casters in the world.

In 1934, Hedge averaged 141 feet with a long cast of 147 feet to top all others in the national tournament.
