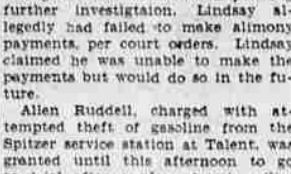
RARE SCHOLARSHIP TO PORTLAND GIRL
