The gathering, presided over by P. E. Bigelow, president, was held in the Hotel Holland and lasted nearly three hours. Members from all parts of southern Oregon attended. The meeting was called in protest of a recent ultimatum by distributors that no beer or wine of any kind would be delivered between the hours of 8 p.m. and 9 a.m. The dispensers decided, Secretary Boise stated, that the proposed delivery schedule would work great hardships on the dispensers in that it would force them to provide refrigeration and sanitary facilities. He said that if the decision of the distributors to curtail delivery service between those hours, dispensers would be without service from 6 p.m. Saturday until 9 a.m. Monday, as there is no delivery on Sunday because of an agreement of the state distributors with the sanction of the state liquor commission.

DEFENDANTS SEEK TELEPHONE GIRL CITED FOR HELP IN MEDFORD FIRE

A motion was filed today to make more definite and certain the complaint in the damage suit of B. F. Burkhardt against Jay R. Williams, Nettie C. Williams, Dale Stokes, Bert Williams and Lois Pretwell, all residents of the Dry Creek district of the Antelope. Burkhardt alleges that the five defendants entered into a "conspiracy" to have him committed to the state insane asylum, and seeks \$500 general damages, \$500 punitive damages, and \$100 attorney fees. The motion avers "the complaint is so indefinite and uncertain the precise nature of the charge is not apparent." The time, place, and parties present at the time of the alleged conspiracy are sought. Burkhardt charges that by reason of an insanity charge filed against him by the defendants April 21, he was arrested and placed in the county jail and given an insanity hearing before County Judge Earl B. Day, who ordered him discharged. A copy of the insanity charge, signed by the defendants, is made a part of the complaint. By reason of this act, Burkhardt avers he suffered great humiliation, public disgrace and his good name impaired. In the past year all parties to the litigation have appeared in justice court proceedings. The plaintiff is represented by Attorney Gus Newbury, and the defendants by Attorney A. E. Reames.

Not Guilty Plea In Chicken Row Slaying

KLAMATH FALLS, May 14.—(AP)—Jack Roemer, indicted by the Klamath county grand jury on a manslaughter charge, today entered a plea of not guilty. Roemer is held, along with his step-father and mother, in connection with the fatal shooting of a neighbor, Jesse Emert, in an alleged quarrel over chickens. Circuit Judge E. B. Ashurst said he would set the trial date sometime during the June term of court.

LOS ANGELES, May 14.—(UP)—Lolita Louis Grey Chaplin Aguirre, better known as Lita Grey Chaplin, divorced wife of Charles Chaplin, today was denied a divorce from Henry Aguirre, Jr., known on the stage as Hank Brown, a dancer. Judge Charles S. Birmel ruled the former actress failed to introduce sufficient evidence for an interlocutory decree. She had charged mental cruelty.
