

SPANISH PREMIER RESIGNS TO FORM VICTORY MINISTRY

Anarchist Revolt Cause of Crisis—Cook In British Embassy Wounded By Bomb.

(By the Associated Press)

Stern, gray-haired Francisco Largo Caballero undertook last (Saturday) night to form a new "win the war" Spanish government.

His second cabinet of the civil war fell yesterday (Saturday) morning, four hours later he again was entrusted with the task of ministry-making.

The government crisis was traced to the anarchist revolt in Catalonia, still not entirely suppressed.

Largo Caballero, extreme socialist, however, said he would try to form a new administration with the same political elements as the old—socialists, left republicans, communists and anarcho-syndicalists.

While the premier worked in Valencia, the government's temporary capital was bombed by a fleet of insurgent airplanes. Several persons were reported wounded.

One bomb exploded in front of the British embassy, critically injuring the embassy's Spanish cook and wounding slightly a doorman. Windows were shattered as were those of a passing streetcar, in which several passengers were injured.

In north Spain, insurgents pressed on in their offensive against Bilbao, Basque capital and important seaport.

NEW ARRESTS IN 'SLAVE' CLEAN-UP

PORTLAND, Ore., May 15.—(AP)—G-men took into custody two more persons today in an effort to break up an alleged vice ring in the Pacific northwest of which Seattle is declared to be the operating base.

William Rickard, U. S. deputy marshal, arrested Fred W. Becker, 70, Portland rooming house operator on a complaint from Seattle. He was ordered held under \$5,000 bond by U. S. Commissioner Kenneth Frazer.

At Walla Walla G-men took into custody Lucille Bower, 18, and she was ordered held under \$3,000 bond, pending removal to Seattle.

The arrests followed three others Thursday when Spencer Crawford, William L. Meyers and Albert Steaton were taken into custody. They were taken to waive removal hearing and were placed in the county jail.

Klamath Mill Help Given Wage Increase

KLAMATH FALLS, May 15.—(AP)—A general wage increase averaging 10 per cent was announced today by nearly every lumber company in the Klamath area. The new scale will become effective June 1.

This is the second raise given this year. Wage boosts of similar size were granted in January and February.

All branches of the industry, including woods, mill and box factory operations, are affected.

Hood River Orchard Workers Organized

HOOD RIVER, May 15.—(AP)—Organization of 150 cannery and fruit workers here was completed today with acceptance of a charter from the Fruit, Cannery and Agricultural Workers union. Some weeks ago fruit growers, taking cognizance of the presence of organizers here, asserted that the move was in retaliation for the opposition displayed by producers last fall to the maritime strike.

ROOSEVELT FARM TENANCY SCHEME HIT BY ECONOMY

WASHINGTON, May 15.—(AP)—President Roosevelt's desire for farm tenancy aids on a "skeleton scale" raised discussion today of cutting the proposed \$135,000,000 fund to only \$20,000,000 or \$30,000,000.

Chairman Jones (D-Tex.) of the house agriculture committee, sponsor of the original measure, said he would rather put off aiding tenants until next year than set up a small scale program.

He added, however, he expected to discuss tenancy and other farm problems with the president before his committee acts.

House consideration of these measures has been deferred by the current economy campaign.

Members of the agriculture committee suggested the president's demand for cutting the cost of the program might be met as follows:

For low interest loans to aid tenants and share croppers in buying farms: \$10,000,000 to \$25,000,000, instead of \$50,000,000.

For government purchase of submarginal lands: \$10,000,000, the amount proposed in the original bill.

For rehabilitation loans to low income farmers for purchase of supplies and equipment: Nothing. Instead of setting up a special \$75,000,000 fund for this purpose, members suggested such loans might be made out of relief funds.
