"Student musicians' contests assume the highest importance, since only through them is public attention turned to the value of music study and interest in state talent aroused. Also, advanced musicians find these contests excellent training for entrance into the young artists' contests."

Oregon entrants in the 1936 national contests all received scholarships to outstanding music schools of the country.
