

Craters Going to Glendale Sunday -- Grants Pass Invades Ashland

NEW TURF FIELD STILL TOO SOFT FOR GAME HERE

Larry Pepper Slated for Crater Mound Duty—Balance of Lineup Undecided Since Loss of Donovan

Games Next Sunday. Medford at Glendale. Crescent City at Roseburg. Grants Pass at Ashland.

Dedication of the newly planted turf field at the high school next Sunday, featuring a Southern Oregon league battle between the Medford Craters and Glendale Loggers was postponed yesterday.

The ball game will be transferred to Glendale. Medford Athletic association officials announced. After a look at the new grass, which was soaked by the rain early this week, E. H. Hedrick, city school superintendent, and association heads decided it would be still too wet to play on by Sunday.

The field will be officially dedicated along with Medford's home schedule with the appearance of the league-leading Roseburg Pirates here June 6. Pepper on Mound.

Larry Pepper, young righthander with the swooping curve ball, will attempt to hurl the Craters out of the cellar against the Loggers Sunday. Pepper, greatly improved from last season, fanned seven out of nine Ashlanders last Sunday and is expected by Manager Mike Balkovick to break the Craters into the win column.

Ray Erickson, who started both the Grants Pass and Ashland games, injured his ankle during practice Wednesday, but will probably be sufficiently recovered by Sunday to fling his fast ball and sharp curve over if needed. Ray Tingate, Medford's third pitcher, is slowly rounding into shape after a late start and will be ready to take his place on the mound soon, Manager Balkovick announced.

Lineup in Doubt. Beaten by infield difficulties since the loss of Donovan to Hill of the Northern California circuit, the huge skipper has been attempting to discover a smooth-clicking quartet of grinder-grabbers. With Dick Lewis at shortstop, the only fixture, the manager has been trying out several players at each of the other three positions, and is still undecided about the opening lineup Sunday.

It may be the same that worked against Ashland last Sunday—Hoffman on first, Swanson on second, Lewis at short and Ricketts on third. Or, Balkovick may switch Swanson either to first or to the outfield. Hoffman to third with Ricketts moving back to his old second base post. Dick Skeeters, the 18-year-old talent high player, is figured a keystone sack possibility.

In the outfield, Malcolm Stine and Dick Sakraida will start in left and center respectively. Right field is still a matter of conjecture, with Ray Lewis, George Glitsen, Swanson—in case he is switched—or Tully Knox drawing the assignment.

Balkovick to Catch. Catching duties will be handled by Manager Mike Balkovick. Lack of battling power in their two league battles has proved the principal Crater weakness. Heavy drills on the art of slugging baseballs will be the order of the day this afternoon and tomorrow, Balkovick said. All players are asked to report at the fairgrounds field at 5 p. m.

Other league clashes will see Grants Pass traveling to Ashland to tangle with the Lithlans, and Crescent City moving to Roseburg for a game that will name the undisputed leader.

UNDERDOGS UPSET 'DOPE' BUCKET IN AMERICAN LEAGUE

Closest First Month in Years — 4 1/2 Games Separate Leaders From Cellarites — Athletics Big Surprise

By Sid Feder Associated Press Sports Writer. The whole thing doesn't make as much sense as an insane asylum, but the figures show the American league is off to a closer and more completely unlooked for start than it has been in years.

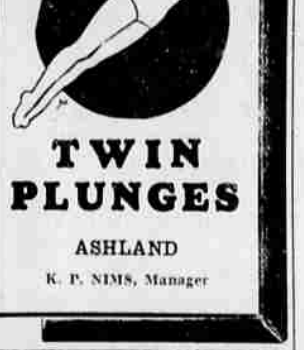
By the end of the first month last year, five games separated first and fourth place. This season, the race was regarded as New York, Detroit, Cleveland and nothing much else. But so far it's been as tight as a mustard plaster—so close in fact, that only 4 1/2 games separate the leaders of the moment, Cleveland's Indians, from the cellar riding St. Louis Browns.

Athletics Big Surprise. And most astonishing of all is that the longest of the long shots, Connie Mack's mystifying Athletics, are in second place, leading both the Yankee and the Tigers. They were on top until yesterday, but the Indians licked the tar out of the Boston Red Sox 16-5, while the A's dropped a 3-2 decision to the Tigers, which gave the tribe the place by a percentage margin.

Hottest of all right now are the reviving Washington Senators—and their sudden form reversal is just as explainable as the rest of the league's ways. Although their pitching still is in a sorry state, they are starting to hit, and on this strength alone have won their last four straight to climb from eighth to fifth. It took two twirlers and 12 innings before they finally overcame the Browns yesterday 5-4 on Osale Blue's timely single.

Thurston Lee found out the Yanks are still his "easy meat." The White Sox southpaw became the first flinger of the year to whip the hitless world champ twice by muffling
