

Mark Twain's "Prince And The Pauper" Opens Craterian Run Today

BILLY AND BOBBY MAUCH AND ERROL FLYNN HEAD CAST

According to Mark Twain, the great novelist and humorist, his story "The Prince and the Pauper" picturization of which opens today at the New Craterian theatre for a three-day run, was "one of those things that might have happened."

The well-known story is that of two boys born at the same time in London in the 16th century—one the young Prince Edward, who first sees the light of day in the palace; the other Tom Canly, who opens his eyes in the slums, the son of a thief and a villain. Their lives become tangled because they look exactly alike.

The producers were fortunate in making the picture in having a perfect team to play the roles of the two boys. They are a pair of what science calls "identical twins"—Billy and Bobby Mauch. Billy plays the pauper and Bobby the prince. It was Bobby who made such a hit as "Anthony Adverse," the child, in the picture of that name. This is Billy's first film role.

Errol Flynn, handsome Irish star, is Miles Hendon, soldier of fortune and defender of the two boys, and the direct means of putting the rightful boy on the throne. Claude Rains plays the rascally Earl of Hertford; Barton MacLane is the pauper boy's thieving father; Phyllis Barry is a barmaid and others in the cast include Henry Stephenson, Alan Hale, Halliwell Hobbes and Montagu Love.

One of the highlights of the picture—and of especial interest at this time—is the coronation ceremony. Great care was used in making the ceremony exactly the same as the age-old English custom that has been used for centuries. The same as was used in the coronation of George VI only last week.
